Co-Chairperson's Message



The 28th AGM of AMCHAM rolls in the midst of a global pandemic with an enormous human toll. We earnestly hope you and your loved ones are safe and healthy!

India-U.S. relations are thriving against the odds and remains critical for the shaping of world order in the 21st century. The India-U.S. relationship has proved resilient amid the immense changes underway in international politics. The United States and India have shared interests in promoting global security and defense, stability, economic prosperity through trade, investment, and coordination on infrastructure, maritime security, counterterrorism, and cyber security have all increased. The United States supports India's emergence as a leading global power and vital partner in efforts to ensure that the Indo-Pacific is a region of peace, stability and growing prosperity. Both U.S. investments in India and Indian investments in U.S. have seen dramatic increase in recent years.

In September 2019, Prime Minister Modi visited Houston and he addressed a large Indian American contingent in the Houston NRG stadium. Along with President Trump, at the event titled Howdy Modi, he reaffirmed Indian American ties, with an emphasis on increased military cooperation. In February 2020, President Trump visited Ahmedabad, Gujarat to address a large Indian crowd at the Motera stadium. The event, titled "Namaste Trump", was a response to the "Howdy Modi" event held in 2019. The event served as a platform for the U.S. president and the Indian prime minister to show off their friendly relationship.

A decade ago, the Indian military had virtually no American equipment in its inventory, but today India flies American aircrafts and helicopters, have American artillery, and have an American ship as well. The India-U.S. security partnership witnessed more arms purchase, bringing to seven the number of U.S. military platforms in India's arsenal, many with components manufactured or assembled in India. Additionally, the signing of three significant defence cooperation agreements; upgraded bilateral, trilateral, and quadrilateral dialogues; and regularised military exercises involving all three services have solidified the defence relationship.

On the economic side, two-way trade in goods and services has increased; India is now the U.S.'s eighth-largest trade partner. The U.S. remained India's top trading partner for the second consecutive fiscal in 2019-20, which shows increasing economic ties between the two countries. According to the data of the commerce ministry, in 2019-20, the bilateral trade between the US and India stood at USD 149 billion and will continue growing as both the sides are engaged in further deepening the economic ties.

During the 2+2 Inter ministerial dialogue of 2019 late last year, both nations finalized signing of The Industrial Security Annex (ISA) to the India-U.S. General Security of Military Information Agreement (GSOMIA) to provide a framework for exchange and protection of classified military information between the U.S. and Indian defence industries. This will enable greater industry-to-industry collaboration for co-production and co-development in the defence sector. The Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) of the Defense Trade and Technology Initiative was also finalized. This supports the two side's processes for identification, development and execution of projects under the DTTI. The Industry-to-Industry Framework under DTTI is serving as a mechanism for dialogue and exchanges between the U.S. and Indian defence industries and their governments. The two sides also agreed to facilitate a MoA between the Ministry of Civil Aviation and the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration, focussed on providing technical assistance to MoCA in developing, modernizing, operating, and maintaining civil aviation infrastructure in India. The two countries also decided to continue dialogue on Basic Exchange and Cooperation Agreement (BECA), explore collaboration on MRO facilities in India, placement of Indian Liaison officers in key US Commands, Annual Tiger Triumph exercise and peacekeeping in the Indo-Pacific, Parliamentary exchange, Science & Technology agreement, and also signed a water MOU amongst other key agreements.

Early this year United States Trade Representative (USTR) took down India from the list of developing countries that are eligible to claim benefits for preferential treatment with respect to Countervailing duties (CVDs) investigations. This falls under the US Generalized System of Preferences (GSP) which is an umbrella that comprises the bulk of preferential schemes granted by industrialized nations to developing countries. India's Ministry of Commerce and Industry and the United States Trade Representative also reached an understanding on various bilateral trade issues raised by the two sides to facilitate trade, improve market access and address issues of interest to both sides.

Energy trade, in particular, has tremendously seen a high growth. During a virtual ministerial meeting of the U.S.-India Strategic Energy Partnership (SEP) earlier this month, the United states and India are working together to modernize power grids in support of India's goal to provide reliable and affordable energy to its population; develop greater integration of modern energy sources into India's power systems; enhance energy security and increase the focus on energy efficiency and combatting air pollution. It emphasizes knowledge exchange for reform in electricity distribution as well as under the Flexible Resources Initiative under the U.S.-India Clean Energy Finance Task Force.

For most U.S. based tech giants, India is now one of their top three customer bases. Indian companies are also investing heavily in the U.S. and Indians have established the largest number of billion-dollar start-up companies in the U.S. founded by immigrants.

In the end, we would like to convey our honest gratitude to both the U.S. and Indian governments for their leadership. Our particular appreciations to all the senior U.S. Embassy representatives, and leaders of the Consulates in India for their unstinted and continuous support; and for their gracious acceptance to be representatives on board of various AMCHAM sectors including their initiatives and activities. We wish to thank the entire National Executive Board and Regional Chairpersons for providing their time, knowledge, expertise and leadership facilitating AMCHAM to carry out the responsibilities.

Last but not the least, we would like to acknowledge Ranjana Khanna, Director General and CEO of AMCHAM and the entire secretariat for competently carrying out their responsibilities to make AMCHAM the apex chamber for U.S. companies in India.

Director General CEO's Report 2019 - 20

I am to report to you an account of our activities during the last one year. It is indeed a tricky job because there is a possibility of my inflating the achievements or a danger of understating the credit side of the ledger in my effort to make an objective assessment. Nonetheless the responsibility of the office demands to make you acquaint with the efforts we made in our endeavour to enlarge the activities of AMCHAM and to work towards promoting the interests of our members, in particular and the U.S. industry in general.

During the year, AMCHAM organized 187 interactions pan India across sectors. These are all listed in the following pages in the Annual Report. However, I will highlight here only a few important major activities.

- The annual door knock delegation to Washington took place in June, in which a 17-member delegation from AMCHAM met with more than 30 U.S. policy makers, staffers and government officials from various agencies, including USTR,

USTDA, Department of Defense, The White House, and the Indian Embassy, among others. This year the delegation with 6 members of Congress, the most from any door knock to date: Representative Raja Krishnamoorthi (D-IL), Representative Vicky Hartzler (R-MO), Representative Henry Cuellar (D-TX), Representative Steve Chabot (R-OH), Representative Brian Mast (R-FL) and Representative Ami Bera (D-CA).

- Continued interactions with policy-makers during the course of the year.
- Continued interactions were held with the Secretaries of concerned departments of Government of India along with their teams.
- At the State level, meetings were held with the senior officials.
- The Committees had had regular meetings and have been actively engaged with policy issues to be taken with the Government.
- Representations on various issues were made to the concerned government departments.
- Regional offices have been having continued interactions with the members.
- Focused interactions were organized across sectors during the year.
- The Manufacturing Committee organized a brainstorming session on 'Make in India Exporting to Global Markets' which focused on accelerating electronics manufacturing in India and on exports for India's growth to a \$5 trillion economy.
- The committee's signature event was held in February 2020 in partnership with Invest India entitled 'Make in India Manufacturing for the World' with a keynote address by Mr. Hardeep Singh Puri, Minister of State (Independent Charge) of Civil Aviation, Housing and Urban Affairs, Minister of State for Commerce & Industry, Government of India.
- AMCHAM's Western Region Signature event under the overarching theme 'The India Opportunity: Accelerating Growth.'
- The Hyderabad Chapter had its 7th Healthcare Conference with the Theme: Evolving Models for Healthcare Delivery in the Digital Era.
- NextGen Leadership Program 2019-20

The first edition of AMCHAM India's NextGen Leadership Program 2019-20, launched in July 2019, has been successfully completed in May 2020. 71 participants from amongst 91 registrants have qualified to be awarded certificates. Feedback received from participants as well as some CEOs has been most encouraging.

4th March 2020 Empowering India's Human Capital for the Future

AMCHAM's signature event for the Karnataka Chapter 'Empowering India's Human Capital for the Future' was held on March 4th in Bengaluru. Mr. Sanjay Koul, Vice Chairman, AMCHAM and Chairman – Karnataka Chapter, AMCHAM, welcomed participants and set the scene for the evening. He talked about the disruptions in the supply chain, the importance of skilling, digitalization and Al in manufacturing. In his special address, Consul General Robert Burgess, U.S. Consulate General Chennai, broadly summarized the recent visit of President Trump to India and said it was a testimony to the U.S.-India relationship through the people to people ties. The joint statement defines areas of future collaboration, especially in defense and homeland security.

Mr. Abhijit Bhaduri, digital transformation coach, speaker, author and columnist spoke on 'The Nature of Talent Demand and Supply in the Context of Future of Work.' Mr. Bhaduri while speaking on the future of work mentioned leadership, talent strategy and culture as the three main areas that have undergone tremendous changes. He said that unlike earlier times worker, work and workplace now overlap each other. He also stressed upon the importance of leveraging skills sets and the agility to make necessary transitions. Quoting the mayhem caused by corona virus outbreak, he highlighted the importance of social factors happening outside the gambit of a workplace yet directly or indirectly affecting decisions. While data management was imperative, dynamic leadership, boundaryless work environment and trust also affects decisions and course of actions. He touched upon being creative and combining experience, hobbies and skills to be more productive. The audience interacted with him on topics like – understanding individuals at workplace, talent retention, content creation, value of informal learning and rewards, amongst others.

In a fireside chat on 'Upcoming Labor Legislations that Impact the Talent Landscape and Cost of Delivery' Mr. Chaitanya N. Sreenivas, VP HR & HR Head India South Asia, IBM and Mr. Vinay Joy, Partner, Khaitan & Co were the speakers. They started with giving a background of the proposed labor reforms, and for ease of doing business and compliance the need of reducing or simplifying the existing 44 central labor laws into 4 codes – wage code, occupational safety, health and working conditions code, code on industrial relations and code on social security. They also touched upon the current trade unions scenario in India and other critical areas such as the Provident Fund and the Maternity Benefits Act. They drew a comparison between the practices being followed by countries other than India like USA, France, EU, etc. and the need for upgrading the Indian Labor Code. Mr. Joy advised HR professionals to familiarize themselves with the expected changes as the government of India was planning to implement all the 4 codes in a single shot.

In the spirit of disruption, Ms. Rekha M. Menon, National Executive Board Member, AMCHAM and Chairman and Senior Managing Director, Accenture in India and Mr. Sanjay Koul, Vice Chairman, AMCHAM, had a candid interactive discussion on 'People Imperatives for the Digital Age' covering a range of topics relating to managing people in uncertain times, skilling, AI and more.

Next on the program was an engaging session on 'Diversity and Inclusion at the Workplace' with an eminent panel of speakers that included Mr. Ramkumar Ramamoorthy, National Executive Board Member, AMCHAM and Chairman & Managing Director, Cognizant India, Cognizant Technology Solutions, Mr. Vihaan Peethambar, Diversity and Inclusion, Human Capital Management, Goldman Sachs and Ms. Shanti Raghavan, Founder and Managing Trustee, Enable India. The moderator of the session, Mr. Sudhir Shenoy, Chairman – Western Region, AMCHAM and CEO, Dow Chemical International, set the scene. The engaging session had panelists sharing candid, hard hitting insights as well as best practices. 27th June 2019	Breakfast Meeting on 'Global In-House Centres (GIC) – Emerging Trends and Increasing Relevance'
	AMCHAM's Tamil Nadu Chapter held a breakfast session on June 27th, 2019 on 'Global In-House Centres (GIC) – Emerging Trends and Increasing Relevance' with guest speaker Mr. Kamalanand Nithianandan, Partner, EY. The meeting commenced with a welcome by Mr. Rajan Aiyer, Chairman – Tamil Nadu Chapter, AMCHAM, who set the tone for the presentation.
	The summary of the presentation by Mr. Kamalanand Nithianandan is as follows: Many companies are building digital solutions that use proprietary data for their businesses in-house, unlike in the past where they traditionally outsourced applications to IT services companies. The oldest MNC captive in India is that of Texas Instruments which established it's captive way back in Bangalore in 1984. Several MNC's are building captive centres in India to scale up operations and build newer products and solutions that they take to their customers globally. India is at the center of this action as the country is at the cusp of its democratic dividend, with over 2.6. million STEM graduated produced each year.
	Global in-house centres (GICs), or captives, of U.S. and European companies are seeing a strong revival in India, with the multinationals either setting up new units or expanding existing operations as they look to use technology to reinvent their businesses. Moreover, India is seen as a fantastic center for innovation. India has over 1,250 captive units, excluding IT/ITES service companies. Last year, these units hired more people than the IT firms, and are set to hire a further 1.5 lakh people over the next two years and this number keeps growing at a steady pace, attritions notwithstanding. The GICs employed nearly one million at the end of the just-concluded financial year.
	GIC's help businesses to meet the demand of new agile ways of working, where the role of GIC's is not just confined to systems integration but also to be an orchestrator of services, delivered by collaborating through a number of product and technology partners. The meet concluded with an insightful interactive session.
25th July 2019	Breakfast Meeting on 'Save Water - Innovation and Best Practices'
	AMCHAM's Tamil Nadu Chapter held a breakfast meeting on July 25th in Chenni. Mr. Vivek Vanmeeganathan, Executive Committee Member – Tamil Nadu Chapter, AMCHAM chaired the meeting. The guest speakers included Mr. Arun Subramaniam, Founder, Earth Fokus, Mr. Beumer Rayen, General Manager, Ford India and Mr. Bijay Mukherjee, Head, Corporate Workplaces, Cognizant India.

The meeting commenced with a welcome by Mr. Vivek Vanmeeganathan who also set the tone for the topic of the day's presentation. Chennai's water crisis has forced the city's ten million residents into survival mode and are forced to make do with what they have — a dwindling and limited supply of water. The city's average annual rainfall is 140 cm per year, but most of the rain water just drains into the sea. So, what caused this massive water crisis, in India's cities? One major reason is the supply of piped water. When people got water at their houses, why bother about the common lakes, tanks and ponds?

The first presentation was made by engineer-turned-entrepreneur Mr. Arun Subramanian who devised an innovative aerator to reduce water consumption and use it intelligently through a product called QuaMist and Ecomist. The nozzle-like structure converted the flow of water into mist and thereby reduced wastage and can save several kilo liters of water, in a large corporate IT facility. A tiny prism-shaped nozzle with three parts — a washer with filter, nozzle and a cap, can be fixed by anyone and turned clockwise for mist mode and anti-clockwise for flow mode. The whole concept revolves around atomization where water gets converted into sprinkles or droplets. When it comes with a certain force, water becomes mist. On an average, an individual wastes 150 liters of water but with mist, it is believed we can save 95% of water. This very small and inexpensive device has now been fitted to taps in corporate offices, factories, shopping malls and homes. The company hopes to contribute in saving millions of liters of water that is otherwise wasted.

The next presentation was made by Mr. Beumer Rayen, who explained how Ford's Chennai vehicle assembly and engine plant has for the past several years worked hard at minimizing the use of water in the manufacturing process. As a signatory to the UN Global Compact Water Mandate, Ford appreciates the need to manage water sustainably. The company has set long-term aspirational goals: to achieve zero water withdrawal in its manufacturing processes and to use freshwater only for human consumption. The Ford plant in Chennai has achieved zero liquid discharge and has also installed equipment to harvest rain water to further reduce the use of drinking water. Over 3,000 cubic meters of rainwater was harvested for use in 2016. The plant uses 100% treated water which is recycled and reused within the plant property. All water needs for the manufacturing processes, toilets, urinals and landscape are met through recycled water. The Ford Chennai plant uses the least amount of fresh water per car in its manufacturing process and is a world record.

Mr. Bijay Mukherjee of Cognizant shared the company's best practices and explained how it has adopted innovative water-saving methods by installing special nozzles into washbasin taps, which reduce the water flow to a mist by atomizing the water into fine droplets, bringing down water consumption by 80% and preventing wastage. It ensures that a lot of water is saved when a person uses the tap. The company has switched over to biodegradable plates in all its cafeterias, temporarily closed the shower facilities at its gyms and minimized the washing of utensils in campuses by cafeteria vendors. Even the water discharged by the air conditioning plant is collected and re-used in the facility. Due to these measures, the company has been able to further optimize water consumption. Cognizant has also created an online forum for employees to share ideas and best practices around water conservation.

The meet concluded with an insightful interactive session. AMCHAM requested all participants to take back the message of water conservation to their workplaces and homes. The combined effort of all is necessary to conserve this precious commodity.

29th Aug 2019 Breakfast Meeting on 'How Academia and Industry Can Collaborate to Make in India and to Skill India'

AMCHAM's Tamil Nadu Chapter held a breakfast meeting on 'How Academia and Industry Can Collaborate to Make in India and to Skill India' on August 29th in Chennai. Mr. Balasundaram Radhakrishnan, Executive Director (Manufacturing) Chennai Vehicle Assembly and Engine Plant, Ford Motor Company, chaired the session, which featured guest speaker Prof. Dr. Bhaskar Ramamurthi, Director, Indian Institute of Technology, Madras. The meeting commenced with a welcome by Mr. Balasundaram Radhakrishnan, who set the tone for the meeting.

After members had introduced themselves, Mr. Balasundaram Radhakrishnan said that university-industry collaboration required careful management and could bring many benefits. These include a two-way flow

of ideas: results can flow out to industry and they can also be in-bound to fuel research questions. For example, sometimes technical problems experienced at the cutting-edge of practice lead to new questions for science. He added that a combination of economic, business and technology factors have led to a steady rise in synergistic partnerships between industry and academia in India.

Dr. Bhaskar Ramamurthi began by responding to the comments made by members when they introduced their companies. He spoke of how the IIT's in India have spurned research in many disciplines and have many patents, most of which have been commercialized. Dr. Ramamurthi said that as an administrator he spends a considerable part of his work day interviewing potential faculty. He said that the faculty at IIT have been given the freedom to pursue research and work with students to nurture them in the area of their specialization. He added that the institute has sixteen academic departments and a few advanced research centres in various disciplines of engineering and pure sciences, with nearly 100 laboratories organized in a unique pattern of functioning. A faculty of international repute, a brilliant student community, excellent technical and supporting staff and an effective administration has all contributed to the pre-eminent status of IIT Madras.

In his presentation Dr. Ramamurthi said that the 3 focus areas of research were: academic research to produce research papers for publication; translational research in the area of industry, space, defense and incubation; and transformational research which had a direct societal impact, disruptive improvement in housing, water, education, healthcare and energy. IIT Madras has over 2,000 ongoing projects, working with 500+ Indian companies, 100+ MNC's and has filed over 195 patents. The Director said that IIT – Madras has established eight new centers of excellence, besides 15 such centers of excellence already functioning in the institute.

The Director also emphasized that IIT Madras is working with many leading companies and also has a research park to incubate startups working in diverse sectors such as auto and automotive energy, power, big data and analytics, mechanical engineering and design, telecom and networks, financial services, product engineering and design, ITES and consulting, bio medical devices, IP services, social enterprises, industry professional bodies, incubators, technology and policy, bio processes amongst others. He said that IIT Madras was open to collaborating with MNC's and that there is space available in the IIT – Madras Research park for American companies to establish research centers.

During the interactive session the Director remarked that the role of academia is to impart knowledge and instill the quest of creativity and questioning. He added that it was the responsibility of industry to train engineers for the role they have been selected.

In conclusion Mr. Radhakrishnan said that, its high time now to reboot the India education system and joint initiatives by industry and academia would play an important part in plugging the talent gap in the years to come. Training individuals for the jobs of the future and allowing them to visualize what is possible today will not only make a difference in their lives but will enrich our communities now and for the future. The meet concluded with an insightful interactive session followed by networking.

26th Sept 2019 Breakfast Meeting on Investing in Tamil Nadu – New Government Policy on Industry

AMCHAM's Tamil Nadu Chapter held a breakfast meeting on September 26th in Chennai with guest speaker Dr. K.P. Karthikeyan IAS, Executive Director, Guidance Bureau, Government of Tamil Nadu. Dr. Karthikeyan began his presentation by describing the state of Tamil Nadu – its strategic location and climate conducive to year-round port operations with three modern ports and 16 minor ports; two of those — Chennai and Thoothukudi which have container handling facilities. He said that the state was well connected with an extensive road and rail network, besides modern telecommunications infrastructure.

The other points made in the presentation included: Tamil Nadu has the third largest economy among the Indian states. Currently, the state's official gross domestic product (GDP) exceeds US\$ 23 billion; the average growth rate in Tamil Nadu has remained around 6-7%, which is much higher than the average growth rate of Indian states.

In the 2018 NCAER (National Council of Applied Economic Research) – State Investment Potential Index Overall Rankings report, Tamil Nadu was ranked the second most attractive state in India for investments. Tamil Nadu has become a popular investment destination on the basis of its unique economic structure. The state is home to more than 100 industrial parks, including developed land, for those who want to start a new business. Unlike many other states in India, where all economic resources are concentrated in one or two regions, Tamil Nadu's economic resources are well distributed across the state.

The state has a large number of windmills that it relies on to generate electricity. It is one of the few states in India that sells electricity to others. Tamil Nadu generates more than half of India's wind energy. The state government operates many large public sector companies in diverse fields like watch-making and paper mills.

Tamil Nadu has a high per capita income and is one of the most stable and urbanized regions in the country. It is India's second largest software exporter, in terms of value. The state has the potential to become a preferred international destination for investments and manufacturing. Through a combination of talent, technology and incentives, the state has all the ingredients to achieve its global ambitions of delivering world class products and services. Tamil Nadu's growth is driven by the automotive, automotive components, textile, manufacturing, defense and aerospace, biotechnology, health, energy, pharmaceutical, animation and the visual effects industries, as well as other areas of IT.

Dr. Karthikeyan said that the Business Facilitation Act provides for an online single window clearances in a time bound manner, online tracking of approvals, deemed approvals for clearances upon reaching the given timelines, prompt grievance redressal mechanism, state level committee for large industries and district level committee for SME's and covers pre-establishment clearances, pre operational clearances, renewals and incentives. The presentation concluded with a very interesting interactive session.

Consul General Robert Burgess addressed members giving them an update on the visa application process and wait times, U.S. – India business relations, the Howdy Modi event and the visit to the U.S. of a Tamil Nadu government delegation led by the Chief Minister.

24th Oct 2019 Breakfast Meeting on the 'State of the Economy: An Industry Perspective'

AMCHAM's Tamil Nadu Chapter organized a breakfast meeting on October 24th in Chennai with guest speaker Mr. A Viswanathan, President, Delphi TVS. The meeting commenced with a welcome by Mr. Rajan Aiyer, Chairman – Tamil Nadu Chapter, AMCHAM. Mr. Aiyer mentioned that there is something wrong with the economy and no one is coming up with the solutions to fix issues to set right matters. He mentioned that every sector of the economy feels the pinch and the ripple effect of government decisions and global affairs.

Mr. Viswanathan began his presentation by stating that today, when two or more people meet, the first thing discussed is no longer the weather but the economy. Everyone has an opinion of what's happening and how it affects them. Mr. Viswanathan made a very insightful presentation starting with decoding the macro elements and said the growth engines for the economy included: investment, net exports, private consumption. He said that due to lack of confidence the consumer was holding back, leading to a rapid fall in rural consumption. The other factors influencing it included: erosion of demand generated by unaccounted income as the economy moves into an era of higher formalization; issues with accessing funding; uncertainty due to job losses and future business incomes; deceleration in growth of income levels; wealth effect; H1B visa tightening; falling interest rates and lower inflation trends.

The government has begun a journey of fiscal inclusion by formalizing the economy through: direct benefit transfer; tackling corruption; transaction reporting; tax intelligence strengthening; tax linkage and demonetization. Examining the other factors affecting the slowing of credit, Mr. Viswanathan opined that this is due to: the collapse of the non-banking finance sector; PSU banks not well geared to accelerate retail credit; introduction of accountability in banks; introduction of credit scoring system; and reduction in unorganized credit.

	Explaining what is needed in the short term, Mr. Viswanathan said that, individuals should have more disposable income; rural incomes should rise; GST rates to be lowered selectively; government to increase infrastructure spending; re-introduce investment incentives; aggressively drive exports and provide confidence on policy stability. While long term course corrections should focus on privatization; position India for a China plus one strategy; promote tourism aggressively; encourage labour intensive exports; revamp education and organize overseas placement to countries such as middle Europe, Japan and SE Asia. While speaking on the recovery path, Mr. Viswanathan stated that social sector reforms in employment generation; health care delivery; quality of education and social security are of great importance and no economy can grow without attention to this sector. He said that the government has taken many measures in this connection, some of which include: pumping liquidity into the lending mechanism; bank weddings; rollback of FII surcharge; DA increase for government employees; release of government payments;
	 implement major infrastructure projects and rate cuts. He added that the long term fundamentals remain intact and is an advantage that India has. Dwelling on what companies should do, Mr. Viswanathan said that businesses should remind ourselves on the long term fundamentals and stay positive; manage cash well; cut back on working capital; cut back on discretionary spend; improve internal efficiencies; be lean and agile; continue to focus on growth strategies; negotiate for better rates; talent acquisition and development and that MNC units in India should promote India as the next manufacturing hub. More importantly, he added that companies should not: cut back on product development; allow talent drain; let short term setbacks derail long term thinking; freeze long term capex plans; lose connect with customer and market and not pull out of the country.
	In conclusion, he said that this slowdown is different from the earlier ones and that it is a mix of cyclical, structural and episodical factors. The impact he said is widespread with many key industries contracting, some decelerating and few still doing better. He went on to say that the economy can get back to over 6% growth in the next two quarters, but that is not enough for India. A range of short term and long term measures are needed to put the economy into a higher trajectory as the long term fundamentals are intact. Giving the last punch Mr. Viswanathan said that as companies, "We need to think simultaneously about surviving in the short term and thriving in the long term." The meeting ended with a Q&A session and Mr. Rajan Aiyer thanking Mr. Viswanathan for this very detailed presentation on the state of the economy.

26th April 2019 27th Annual General Meeting

The 27th Annual General Meeting of the American Chamber of Commerce in India was held on April 26th, 2019 at the Hotel Leela Palace, Chanakyapuri, New Delhi. The theme of the event was 'AMCHAM India: Enhancing the U.S.-India Economic Partnership.' The meeting was chaired by Mr. Krish Iyer, Chairperson, AMCHAM India and President & CEO, Walmart India.

Ms. Ranjana Khanna, Director General CEO, AMCHAM, welcomed participants and presented the Annual Report. She highlighted the important events organized by AMCHAM during the year. The Annual Report was unanimously adopted.

Mr. Krish Iyer, in his opening remarks, said that he it was an honour for him to be the chairperson for AMCHAM India for the past year and during his tenure he had seen the U.S.- India relationship strengthening of the strategic and defense ties and bilateral trade and the first U.S.-India 2+2 Dialogue, the U.S.-India Commercial Dialogue and the reconstituted U.S.-India CEOs Forum.

The statutory AGM concluded with the presentation of 10 years' service recognition awards to Mr. L.N. Agarwal and Mr. Chittaranjan Das by Mr. Arun M. Kumar, Vice Chair, AMCHAM and Chairman & CEO, KPMG in India.

Inaugural Session

The inaugural session of AMCHAM's AGM began with welcome remarks and an introduction of the esteemed speakers by Ms. Ranjana Khanna, Director General CEO, AMCHAM India, followed by opening remarks by Mr. Krish Iyer, Chairperson, AMCHAM and President & CEO, Walmart India. In his remarks he touched upon the shared values and similar challenges that both countries faced and reaffirmed the strides in the U.S.-India partnership in defense. Mr. Iyer talked about how U.S. companies have made significant commitments in India through aerospace, defense, financial services, banking and e-commerce. He thanked the Embassy for all their efforts to support U.S. industry in India.

Ambassador Kenneth I. Juster, U.S. Ambassador to India delivered the keynote address, in which he recognized the hard work put in by the American business community to strengthen the U.S.-India economic partnership. He also talked about the importance for both countries to play a role in the Indo-Pacific.

Ambassador Dr. S. Jaishankar, former Foreign Secretary, GOI, in his address, explained the transformation of Indo American relations over the last twenty years and emphazied the change in mindset was visible on the economic side. In reflecting on the causes of the transformation of the relationship he outlined the end of the Cold War which expanded political and security partnerships. He also touched upon the removal of geo political differences and the larger societal feelings between counties, such as the Indian diaspora in the U.S., that has resulted in increasing appreciation. Ambassador Jaishankar discussed how digitization was central to India's growth process and how a new equilibrium would emerge in different sectors.

Ambassador Juster released AMCHAM's coffee table book 'Investing in People – Changing Lives: U.S. Companies in India' which showcased the stories of how our members impact people pan India, whether

through training, re-skilling, education, medical assistance, women's empowerment initiatives, encouraging entrepreneurship or CSR endeavours across multiple sectors. The photo exhibition of the same was displayed in the prefunction area.

Ambassador Juster, Ambassador Jaishankar and Mr. Arun M. Kumar, Vice Chair, AMCHAM and Chairman & CEO, KPMG in India, released the book which would be presented to the new government to showcase the good work done by U.S. companies.

Mr. Arun M. Kumar thanked both Ambassadors for their optimistic messages and emphasized that trade and investment was strong between both countries. He talked about how critical it was to integrate supply chains and participate in India's strategic infrastructure development.

Industry 4.0: Smart Manufacturing

The next session 'Industry 4.0: Smart Manufacturing' featured a keynote address by Mr. Ramesh Abhishek, Secretary, Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade. Mr. Som Satsangi, Managing Director, Hewlett Packard Enterprise India, introduced the Secretary and all the panellists. Mr. Satsangi pointed out how Industry 4.0 would humanize machines and usher in Al thus having the potential to change the way we live and work. He set the scene to focus on three themes, feasibility of smart manufacturing in India, developing smart manufacturing and the scalability of it.

In his keynote address, Mr. Ramesh Abhishek mentioned that the Government of India has worked hard to make India investor friendly and thanks U.S. companies for their support. He was hopeful that some of the challenges that remain could be faced with the latest technology and modernization. The manufacturing sector was 17% of the GDP. He talked about how industry 4.0 could benefit India and how larger companies could help smaller companies adapt technologies. He requested industry to provide inputs on skilling and reskilling.

Mr. Som Satsangi moderated the session with panellists: Mr. Salil Gupte, President, Boeing India, Mr. Amit Bansal, Co-Chair – Manufacturing Committee, AMCHAM and Managing Director, Corning India and Mr. Sudhir Shenoy, CEO, Dow Chemical International.

Mr. Sudhir Shenoy talked about the substantial progress that India has made in the past few years. He mentioned that standards and regulations were a challenge, that internal standards were compliant but often not in line with government standards. Now days everything can be done digitally making it is easy to detect violations, but it doesn't always work in the real world, hence, he noted, upgrading the acts and policies to make it 4.0 relevant was important. Mr. Shenoy said Dow has the world's largest engineering capability in India and applauded India's intellect and capabilities but the challenge with approvals for operation has persisted.

Mr. Amit Bansal pointed out that one of the challenges of industry 4.0 was data and how to convert data into insights. Some companies have decades of data that they struggle to make use of. He talked about how people would adapt and learn skills to do their job but also how to work with machines. With industry 4.0 some jobs would be lost, some jobs would need reskilling and encourage industry to work closely with academia to ensure classroom lessons were true to the reality of industry.

Mr. Salil Gupte discussed, from a security perspective, how each country varies on how to handle data. He emphasized that the closer partnership between U.S. and India was helpful in unlocking capabilities for smart solutions. He also talked about how smart solutions can help manage the production side to offer customized offerings to customers. He gave an example about how airplanes need individual parts and how smart solutions can the necessary parts at individual locations in the supply chain and provide customers better services without delay.

Secretary Ramesh Abhishek said the government understood the importance of data security and privacy and were working on data privacy laws. He also said that people were ready to adopt technologies and that not adopting technology was not an option. He discussed that reskilling by industries was important and that the government needed to also chip in. He said that investors should be able to know the speed at which approvals come in each state and the government was looking into a way to rank states.

Trade Winds Indo Pacific 2019

Ms. Aileen Nandi, Minister Counselor for Commercial Affairs, U.S. Embassy, gave an overview of Trade Winds Indo Pacific. The 2019 U.S. Commercial Service Trade Winds program would include an Indo-Pacific focused business forum in New Delhi, India consisting of regional and industry specific conference sessions as well as pre-arranged consultations with U.S. Diplomats representing commercial markets throughout the region. It would also feature individual matchmaking based on input from their Commercial Specialists throughout the region, and bring together potential buyers, agents, distributors and joint-venture partners in the following Indian cities on May 8-10: New Delhi, Mumbai, Ahmedabad, Bengaluru, Chennai, Hyderabad, Kolkata.

Reskilling for the Future

The next session 'Reskilling for the Future' featured a keynote by Dr. Sunita Sanghi, Senior Advisor, Ministry of Skill and Entrepreneurship. She discussed the impact of technology in everyday life and how these can be addressed by the ever-changing ecosystem. There was a gap between what industries need and what education has been able to give. The current education system was producing people with very little industry connect. She emphasized the need of the hour was to have a strong industry institute where industry can shape curriculum or have an industrial partner in the form of an industrial training institute. Industry needs to provide work space to education institutes to have a hands-on understanding on how industries work. Unless and until there is industry linkage, there will always be a significant gap.

Mr. Karan Bajwa, Managing Director, IBM India, welcomed Dr. Sanghi and all other panellists. The other panellists were Ms. Rekha Menon, Chairman and Senior Managing Director, Accenture in India and Mr. Phil Shaw, Chief Executive – India, Lockheed Martin India.

Mr. Bajwa observed that skills were a top priority in the government and that technology was an enabler for industry while being seen as both a transformative tool and a disruption of employment at the same time. He said there was a huge opportunity to reskill the workforce and this could be ensured by imparting this early in the education system. He mentioned that close to 54% work population who are graduating were found to be unemployable due to skill mismatch and only 10% were certified as a match for the skills they possess. There was a need to put systems in place where people are trained for what they need to possess. Mr. Bajwa said, in the labour market, about 80% children drop out before the tenth standard and before completing their secondary education. While commenting on the labour market being dualistic in nature, he said, on one hand there was an organized centre, while on the other it was difficult to map the skill requirements. Apprentice programs by higher education centres to reskill graduates entering the labour market was a key for success in this direction.

Ms. Rekha Menon mentioned that soft skills were the most critical aspect of training as part of the reskilling process. Building and imparting new skills was hugely imperative and the need of the hour. She said that this was a huge business opportunity because a good share of talent lies in India. The key lies in finding a balance between reskilling and refreshing the workforce. Reskilling remains more important because only a skilled workforce can be refreshed. Though it largely depends on an individual's capabilities, there were areas that need to be automated which would lead to creation of new opportunities. The transition of skills in people shifts from how this could be viewed as an opportunity and not as a job loss with the advent of technology. Creating a platform where skills were needed which highlighted what was already available would be useful. Throwing away the old learning framework and drafting a new one in line with current requirements would be the key to success.

Mr. Phil Shaw felt that the government should incentivize industry for skilling yet on the other hand if this was an individual company's priority then how could it be institutionalized? The SHREYAS initiative by the government was a program conceived for students in degree courses, primarily non-technical, with a view to introduce employable skills into their learning, promote apprenticeship as integral to education and amalgamate employment facilitating efforts of the government into the education system so that clear pathways towards employment opportunities were available to students during and after their graduation. He said that colleges and higher education institutes should introduce apprentice programs and allow people to take courses according to this. When Lockheed Martin began operations in India there were no skilled staff in defense so they needed to train people who could do the job. As a result, Lockheed Martin

was successful in creating a skilled ecosystem within the last ten years. In India, the people were a lot younger, eager and created a dynamic workforce of high quality which turned out to be advantageous. Lockheed Martin also encouraged women to attend skills development programs and join industries and continues to work across the country to engage more women in aviation, work with women in villages and bring them into the main workforce.

Ms. Sanghi, in closing stated that there should be one central competency skill level across all states and for that a smart portal has been put in place. When the policy on skills development was drafted the focus was on inclusion. Policy since 2015 was not only on creating demand, but on continued lifelong learning, counselling and mobilizing the youth. Industry should work together with academia to skill labour as per what is needed and essential for their upliftment.

U.S.-India Partnership: The Road Ahead

This session featured a candid conversation between Ms. Indrani Bagchi, Senior Diplomatic Editor, Times of India and former Indian Ambassadors to the U.S. — Ambassador Meera Shankar and Ambassador Arun Kumar Singh. While expressing her views, Ambassador Shankar shared that despite occasional surprises India has managed well with the Trump administration. She stated that the growing strategic partnership was propelled given the increasing converging interest in Asia particularly with how both countries manage the rise of an increasing assertive China. Another area of common concern was terrorism and the intent to reduce and eliminate terrorism.

Both Ambassador Arun Kumar Singh and Ambassador Shankar opined that there was a growing dissonance on the trade and economic front from both countries. On India's position on data localization and e-commerce and GSP, Ambassador Singh stated that similar dialogues were happening in some other countries too and the issue could be addressed keeping in view the interest of each side. On the e-commerce sector it was felt that given the deep base of people involved and the impact on jobs and livelihoods in India, feasible discussions should be sought.

On GSP the opinion was, giving preference to any one country was not recommended and an approach of common policy for trade relations across countries would be best suited. If India makes concessions it would expect concessions from the U.S. too. The view was the best way to work around any challenges was to look at synergies and economic and strategic convergence. On the issue of technology and it's impact on strategic partnership between the U.S. and India the opinion was that India should take a strategic view of 5G and make choices accordingly since it would have an enormous footprint on a range of related activities. On security relations the view was that the relationship had come a long way but could be strengthened further. It was felt that in the Indo-Pacific area there was growing convergence given the impact of a rising China.

In closing Ms. Bagchi thanked the panelists and said that we were likely to see action in all these areas post the elections and the formation of the new government.

Vision for the Future of the U.S.-India Partnership

For the final session, 'Vision for the Future of the U.S. – India Partnership,' Shri Pranab Mukherjee, Hon'ble Former President of India was the chief guest. At the onset Ms. Ranjana Khanna, Director General CEO, AMCHAM India and Mr. Atul Dhawan, Honorary Secretary & Treasurer, AMCHAM and Partner, Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu India LLP, warmly welcomed the hon'ble chief guest while expressing the honour and gratitude to him gracing AGM with his presence. Mr. Atul Dhawan spoke of the strategic U.S.-India with a special reference to the increasing bilateral trade and investments of the two countries across both nations. He also mentioned how the Indo-Pacific region has been playing an instrumental role in the much-valued relationship of India and the U.S.

Mr. Krish Iyer, Chairperson, AMCHAM, briefly summarized the day's proceedings and put it in the right context for the benefit of Shri Mukherjee. The discussions through the day brought to light that there exists untold potential in the U.S.-India partnership given the growth in the relationship over the past two decades.

India has emerged as the most attractive and the sought-after destination with a lot in common between the largest and the oldest democracies especially the cultural values and transparency. The bilateral opportunities offer not just avenues for economic collaboration but also opportunities for partnering in India's inclusive growth and avenues to work on multilateral platforms.

The Hon'ble chief guest Shri Pranab Mukherjee started by sharing his wonderful journey that started 50 years ago when he entered the magnificent building of the Parliament House. He expressed gratitude to AMCHAM for inviting him to make an address at AGM. He made a special mention of the strong commonalities between the two countries with a few of them being ethics, systems, strong civil society, informative media and responsive citizens. He shared several anecdotes from history and politics which have laid the road map for echoing democratic values and growing relations between the two countries. He shared that since the day of India's independence, the U.S. was the largest investor and technical collaborator with India. There has been huge development since the last three and half decades particularly since there has been massive liberalization and deregulation in India. He spoke of how he steered the foreign regulation act in the 70's and how nineteen years later he strongly advocated for portfolio investment from foreign companies. He shared his interest to mention these milestones and perceptions with the distinguished members of AMCHAM who presently play an important role in building and fostering a closer relationship between India and the U.S. He also spoke of the specific areas where collaborations have been significant which included healthcare, technology, smart cities, agriculture, infrastructure and energy. He expressed that sustainable growth cannot take place in silos, it should be orderly and inclusive.

The Honb'le Former President also shared his personal experience and involvement in the landmark signing of the Civil Nuclear Cooperation Agreement with the U.S. He shared another personal anecdote on how quick decision and personal responses took place during the signing of the Defense Framework Cooperation Agreement. In closing he urged the distinguished guests that we must build a positive and proactive cooperation between the two countries which can influence the international scenario to a considerable extent. With much gratitude Ms. Ranjana Khanna thanked the Hon'ble Former President for his valuable address and concluded AGM.

Tax, Tariff & Regulatory Affairs Committee Meeting on Pre Budget with Chairman, CBDT

AMCHAM's Taxation, Tariff and Regulatory Affairs Committee participated in a pre-budget meeting with the Chairman, CBDT on June 4th, 2019 at the Ministry of Finance, North Block, New Delhi. The meeting was chaired by Mr. P.C. Mody, Chairman, CBDT. Mr. Akhilesh Ranjan, Member, CBDT and other functionaries attended the meeting. AMCHAM was represented by Mr. Sandeep Chaufla, Chairman – Tax, Tariff & Regulatory Affairs Committee, AMCHAM and Mr. Naveen Agarwal, Co-Chairman – Tax, Tariff & Regulatory Affairs Committee, AMCHAM and Wg. Cdr. Rajiv Anand, Program Director, AMCHAM. AMCHAM made a presentation and highlighted issues that merit review of various aspects of taxation currently impacting U.S. companies in India.

Some of the issues discussed included: corporate tax rates – case for reduction, replacing DDT with TDS on dividends, digital taxation – SEP related issues, business reorganization – rationalization, Authority for Advance Rulings (AAR) – clarifications, Special Economic Zones (SEZs) – making it attractive for developers/ units, among other topics. An exhaustive 'Pre-Budget Memorandum 2019-20 for Direct Taxes' was also handed over to the Gol.

7th June 2019 Cyber Security Committee Meeting

The Cyber Security Committee meeting was chaired by Mr. Deepak Maheshwari from Symantec and cochaired by Mr. Kishore Balaji from Intel Technologies and Mr. Rajnish Gupta from RSA Technologies on 7th June 2019 at the Intel office in Nehru Place. Perspective from the U.S. Embassy was shared by Mr. Joshua Johnson, Trade Officer, Economic, Environment, Science and Technology Affairs. It was decided that the committee would primarily focus upon (1) Personal Data Protection Bill and (2) Review of National Cyber Security Policy. State wise events across Delhi, Bengaluru and Mumbai would be planned keeping the above thematic areas in mind along with focus group discussion with MeiTY and other ministries to deliberate and educate the GOI on global cyber security mandates. The U.S. Embassy has shown interest to support AMCHAM with their initiatives by inviting key government officials and experts from U.S. government to discuss and participate in focused roundtables and events.

9th - 13th June Annual Door Knock to Washington DC 2019

The annual AMCHAM India door knock delegation to Washington DC was led by AMCHAM's Chairman, Mr. Phil Shaw, Chief Executive, Lockheed Martin India, from June 9th – 13th, 2019. The main purpose of the door knock was to inform and sensitize U.S. policy-makers and lawmakers on issues impacting U.S. companies' operations in India. The delegation interacted with important players in the economic relationship and key decision-makers. A white paper highlighting opportunities and key issues for identified sectors was prepared with knowledge partner KPMG for presenting to influencers leading the U.S.-India Economic partnership. The document provided an industry perspective on India's economy while highlighting some of the key sectorwise industry related challenges faced by U.S. companies operating in India.

Upcoming USG visits and other dialogues scheduled for the near future were shared with members.

25th July 2019 Energy Committee Meeting

A meeting of AMCHAM's Energy Committee was held on July 25th at the AES India office in Gurugram and was chaired by Mr. Rajendra Shrivastav, President AES India. The committee deliberated on energy storage, renewables, energy transition, biofuels and current developments in refining and petrochemicals. The integration of renewables and battery energy storage (BES) for an uninterrupted supply to the grid was seen as the next big development on the horizon. While BES for electric vehicles also had significant potential, it was felt that charging infrastructure needed to be in place before the full potential of EVs could be realized. While lithium ion batteries for energy storage were seen as the leading technology offering the fastest response time, other technologies using nickel ion etc. were also good contenders. Lithium ion is not produced locally and is imported. Biofuel technologies converting waste to liquid fuels like ethanol, crude and furnace oil also offered a good business opportunity and some relief from hydrocarbon imports. The disruption in conventional transportation fuels has encouraged the integration of refining and petrochemicals. Technologies such as crude to chemicals were now on being considered seriously.

Members also discussed the above issues in the context of local manufacturing and integration into the global value chain. Challenges in each of these areas were discussed at length and the mobilization of members to address stakeholders. The challenge to contain a rise in global temperatures to 2 degrees Celsius was driving energy transition towards low carbon fuels. The themes that emerged for the next meeting were energy storage including renewables, petrochemicals and biofuels.
25th July 2019 Agriculture & Food Processing Committee Meeting

AMCHAM's Agriculture & Food Processing Committee organized its first meeting on July 25th at the Cargill Office in Gurugram. Mr. Simon George, Chairman – Agriculture & Food Processing Committee, AMCHAM and President, Cargill India welcomed participants. In his opening remarks, he spoke about the need of having a specific agenda for the committee and to focus on select activities. Ms. Tiffany Landry, Agricultural Attaché, Foreign Agricultural Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture, U.S. Embassy, gave an overview of her department and shared some specific initiatives for members undertaken by the U.S. Embassy. Mr. Shibu Mathews, Commercial Specialist, U.S. Commercial Service, U.S. Embassy, also shared how they assist American companies in extending their operations to India. The committee discussed a workplan for the upcoming months which included participation in World Food India 2019, creating awareness about water conservation in agriculture through integrated technology and focus on FPO's. The closing remarks and vote of thanks were given by Ms. Neelima Dwivedi, Co-Chairperson – Agriculture & Food Processing Committee, AMCHAM and Vice President – Corporate Affairs, PepsiCo India Holdings Pvt. Ltd.

25th July 2019

First Stakeholders National Consultation meeting of SNCM (for revision of NLEM 2015) organized by Department of Health Research (DHR), Government of India

The Standing National Committee on Medicine (SNCM) had its first stakeholders national consultation meeting for the revision of NLEM-2015 on 25th July 2019 at the Indian Red Cross Society Building, Department of Health Research (DHR), New Delhi. Ms. Jyotsna Ghoshal, Co-Chairperson – Pharma Committee, AMCHAM, and members of the Medical Devices Committee attended the meeting. The agenda of the meeting was to discuss any feedback on the previous NLEM-2015, get inputs/comments on oncology drugs and cardiology drugs, addition of penicillin preparations in NLEM and get information about antimicrobial resistance (AMR) consultation. During the meeting Dr. YK Gupta and Prof. Balram Bhargava – DG, ICMR, stated the objective of the consultation was to ensure absolute transparency. This would be standing committee and meetings would take place at regular intervals. Recommendations would be attempted at least once in six months and industry would be given adequate time to suggest/implement changes in NLEM.

26th July 2019 Indian Council of Medical Research, Government of India, in association with Biotech Consortium India Limited (BCIL) organized 'Consultative Meeting for Developing a Roadmap for Scaling-up of MedTech Innovations'

AMCHAM members attended 'Consultative Meeting for Developing a Roadmap for Scaling-up of MedTech Innovations Striving for Quality, Safety and Affordable Access' organized by the Indian Council of Medical Research, in association with Biotech Consortium India Limited (BCIL) on July 26th at the Indian Council of Medical Research, New Delhi. Dr. Vinod Paul, Member, Niti Aayog, along with Dr. Balram Bhargava, DG, ICMR and Secretary, DHR, addressed participants, followed by a presentation on ICMR vision, role in diagnostic devices and scaling up the biodesign philosophy in India. This meeting brought together all key stakeholders and policy makers to deliberate on key issues/challenges faced by medical device start-ups and propose possible solutions to assist them in scaling-up and facilitating market access so that they can be used by the masses.

31st July 2019

Infrastructure & Smart Cities Committee Meeting

AMCHAM's Infrastructure & Smart Cities Committee met under the leadership of Mr. Anand Chidambaram, Chairman – Infrastructure & Smart Cities Committee, AMCHAM and Managing Director, Progressrail, Mr. Samit Ray, Co-Chairman – Infrastructure & Smart Cities Committee, AMCHAM and Regional Director – Government Affairs & Public Policy South East Asia, UTC, and Mr. Ambrish Bakaya, Co-Chairman – Infrastructure & Smart Cities Committee, AMCHAM and Director Corporate Affairs, HPE, in New Delhi on July 31st. The committee discussed avenues in infrastructure since the sector has now reflected marked activity post elections and budget. It was emphasized that the ongoing efforts on smart cities be kept up and efforts be made to identify ongoing projects vis a vis capabilities of members to pursue possibilities with MoHUA. A deep dive on smart cities was proposed and accepted for August 13th at the UTC Office, Gurugram. Other areas of concentration specific to the Infrastructure sector would be identified at the next meeting.

6th Aug 2019 Cyber Security, 5G and Technological Innovation Roundtable with Mr. Harold Furchtgott-Roth, Hudson Institute

A roundtable was organized by AMCHAM on August 6th on cyber security, 5G and technological innovation with Mr. Harold Furchtgott-Roth, Director, Center for the Economics of the Internet, Hudson Institute. He visited India and addressed AMCHAM's Cyber Security and ICT Committee members on topics such as technological innovation, 5G and different types of security risks posed by equipment from China, including possible industrial espionage, sabotage, and supply-chain dependency. The session was moderated by Mr. Deepak Maheshwari, Chairman – Cyber security Committee, AMCHAM.

13th Aug 2019 Infrastructure & Smart Cities Committee Meeting

AMCHAM's Infrastructure & Smart Cities Committee met under the leadership of Mr. Anand Chidambaram, Chairman - Infrastructure & Smart Cities Committee, AMCHAM and Managing Director, Progressrail, Mr. Samit Ray, Co-Chairman – Infrastructure & Smart Cities Committee, AMCHAM and Regional Director – Government Affairs & Public Policy South East Asia, UTC and Mr. Ambrish Bakaya, Co-Chairman -Infrastructure & Smart Cities Committee, AMCHAM and Director Corporate Affairs, HPE, in New Delhi on Aug 13th. Representatives from the Commercial Section of the U.S. Embassy were invited to the meeting. Highlighting the lack of transparency and insight into the government perspective with regard to the status of various projects in general and the program as a whole, the committee decided to seek assistance from the Embassy to consider G2G meetings at the level of Secretary MoUD, Chairman AAI, MD DMRC, Secretary MoRTH, and Chairman Railway Board. In addition, the Embassy was also requested to facilitate similar meetings with UNDP, ADB and World Bank to enable obtaining clarity of funding planned in these sectors in the country. The Commercial Section would also assist in seeking information from their counterparts in Bangladesh, Nepal and Sri Lanka with regard to government plans in corresponding sectors. With the proposed G2G meetings and follow up round table meetings with functionaries for organized presentations detailing various aspects of projects, the committee would draw up a list of proposed projects to be funded between 2019-24, sectors being prioritized per state, timelines, DPR consultants, nodal points of contact and funds earmarked for these projects. The committee also envisaged to analyze opportunities thrown up in these deliberations and revert to the projects with specific collaborative, participative, tech supportive suggestions of AMCHAM members vis a vis their individual capability offerings.

19th Aug 2019 Manufacturing Committee Meeting

A meeting of AMCHAM's Manufacturing Committee was held on August 19th in New Delhi under the leadership of Mr. Amit Bansal, Co-Chairman – Manufacturing Committee, AMCHAM and Managing Director, Corning India and Mr. Arijit Sen, Co-Chairman – Manufacturing Committee, AMCHAM and Senior Director, Global Government Affairs and Public Policy, Flex Group. The committee discussed manufacturing in India for global markets, production-based incentives, manufacturing in ASEAN countries, corporate taxation, capacity utilization, MSIPs, inverted duty structure in the automotive sector, among other topics. The committee decided to organize an event focused on electronics manufacturing next month. The differentiated advantage that India could have over other countries, ease of doing business and the benefits U.S. companies bring to India when they invest, were also discussed. A core group of electronics manufacturing companies was formed to carry the momentum forward.

20th Aug 2019 CSR Committee Meeting

Ltd., Ms. Sangita Ghalay, Co-Chairperson – CSR Committee, AMCHAM and Head – CSR, Honeywell India and Ms. Kshitija Krishnaswamy, Co-Chairperson – CSR Committee, AMCHAM and Director, Corporate Citizenship, Accenture India, on August 20th in Gurugram at the Cisco office. The committee discussed planning for the full day CSR event and how to leverage the Self4Society platform. It was decided to conduct CSR best practice sharing project site visits this year and begin with a Honeywell project in east Delhi. Ongoing collaboration with USAID on the TB Pledge and health initiatives was also discussed.

21st Aug 2019 6th Anti-Corruption Compliance and Risk Management Master Class

The Anti-Corruption & FCPA Compliance Committee organized it's 6th Anti-Corruption Compliance and Risk Management Master Class in New Delhi on August 21st. Ms. Ranjana Khanna, Director General CEO, AMCHAM, welcomed participants. In her address she pointed out that despite a slight rise in India's rank to 78 in the Corruption Perception Index 2018 released by Transparency International, there was still a lot to be done in terms of fighting corruption in India. She expressed her gratitude to the U.S. Embassy, Kobre & Kim, Baker McKenzie, FTI Consulting and Genpact for supporting the event.

Mr. Gaurav Ajmani, Chairman – Anti-Corruption & FCPA Compliance Committee, AMCHAM and Associate General Counsel, Business Conduct & Ethics, Amazon Seller Services, introduced the theme and provided an overview of sessions. He shared highlights of some of the recent happenings and also gave an overview of the progress made in fighting corruption in India. This was followed by a special address delivered by Mr. Robert Garverick, Minister Counselor for Economic Affairs and Environment, Science and Technology, U.S. Embassy.

The first session was a presentation on 'Top Trends in FCPA, UK Bribery Act & and Recent Corruption Cases – Introduction of the Case Study' by Mr. Vasu Muthyala, White-Collar, Corporate & Individual Investigations, and Enforcement Partner, Kobre & Kim, Ms. Mini vandePol, Asia Pacific Head, Compliance and Investigations, Baker & McKenzie and Mr. Sunny Mann, Compliance and Investigations Partner, Baker & McKenzie. The second session featured a panel discussion on the 'Best Practices for Structuring the Right Anti-Corruption Program for Your Organization – What is Too Little or Too Much?' It was moderated by Ms. Bhawna A. Ranganadhan, Co-Chairperson – Anti-Corruption & FCPA Compliance Committee, AMCHAM and Vice President, Legal and Compliance, Genpact and the panellists included Ms. Shukla Wassan, Executive Director-Legal & Corporate Affairs, South Asia, Hindustan Coca-Cola Beverages, Ms. Saloni Tuteja, Director – Legal, South Asia, Zimmer Biomet & Mr. Ambrish Bakaya, Director-Corporate Affairs, Hewlett Packard Enterprise.

In the third session, Mr. Gaganpreet Singh Puri, Partner and Leader, Forensic Services, PwC India, gave a comprehensive presentation on the 'Use of Technology in Investigations – AI and Machine Learning.' Thereafter, in session 4, Mr. Puneet Singh, FBI Attaché, U.S. Embassy, spoke about 'Cross Border Investigations' and also touched upon the rising cyber security threats in India and how FBI works with Indian authorities and society to combat it.

Prof (Dr.) Madhu Bhalla, Vice Chair, Transparency International India, in the next session spoke about the 'Fight Against Corruption.' While giving a brief about the recent work carried out by Transparency International, she shared some alarming illustrations of corruption in India, for example, as per a recent survey, bribery in India has increased by 46%.

To encompass recent trends, session 6 focussed on 'The New Risks & Best Practices in Global Investigations – Trade Sanctions, Data Privacy, MeToo, and Other Misconduct' which was presented by Mr. Vasu Muthyala, White-Collar, Corporate & Individual Investigations and Enforcement Partner, Kobre & Kim, Ms. Mini vandePol, Asia Pacific Head, Compliance and Investigations, Baker & McKenzie and Mr. Sunny Mann,

Compliance and Investigations Partner, Baker & McKenzie. This session covered sanctions and export controls, data protection, GDPR, MeToo and investigations.

In the next session Mr. Anuj Bugga, Senior Managing Director, FTI Consulting and Mr. Prasad Shetty, Managing Director, FTI Consulting, focussed on case studies 'M&A Red Flags and Bribery, Corruption and Investigations.' They explained the high-risk touchpoints in bribery and corruption risks in mergers and acquisitions that included geographical risks, government's touchpoints, third parties, corporate governance, management reputation and business partners. In the last session on 'POCA Guidelines and Enforcement,' Mr. Ashish Singh, Partner, Dua Associates drew a comparison between POCA and the FCPA explaining the details of the POCA Act that are applicable to business organizations. The last presentation was given by Ms. Deniz Muslu, Assistant Director – Office of Enforcement Analysis, Bureau of Industry and Security, U.S. Department of Commerce, who provided an introduction of the BIS. The master class concluded with closing remarks from Ms. Bhawna A. Ranganadhan, Co-Chairperson – Anti-Corruption & FCPA Compliance Committee, AMCHAM.

21st Aug 2019 Defense Committee Meeting

Some of the areas discussed were carbon to chemicals, bringing best practises in procurement, engagement with CHT and suggestions on how the secretariat could support the business interests of its members going forward.

17th Sept 2019 Make in India – Exporting to Global Markets

AMCHAM organized a brainstorming session on 'Make in India – Exporting to Global Markets' on September 17th in New Delhi. The first session was on 'Accelerating Electronics Manufacturing in India: U.S. Companies.' Ms. Ranjana Khanna, Director General CEO, AMCHAM made opening remarks and welcomed participants. Mr. Richard Hopkins, Global President, Flex Group, set the scene and theme for the deliberations. Mr. Amit Bansal, Co-Chairman – Manufacturing Committee, AMCHAM and Managing Director, Corning India, made remarks. Ms. Anubhuti Bhrany, Head – Government Relations, India, HP India, facilitated the conversation. Mr. Sanjay Kumar Rakesh, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology and Dr. Arabinda Mitra, Scientific Secretary, Office of the Principal Scientific Adviser to the Government of India, joined the session.

The second session focused on 'Exports for India's Growth to a \$5 Trillion Economy.' Mr. Ashwini Aggarwal, Director – Government Affairs, Applied Materials India, set the scene and Mr. Arijit Sen, Co-Chairman – Manufacturing Committee, AMCHAM and Senior Director, Global Government Affairs and Public Policy, Flex Group, facilitated the conversation. Ms. Asha Nangia, Senior Director, Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology and Ms. Anna Roy, Sr. Adviser, NITI Aayog participated in the brainstorming session.

The conversation revolved around how the electronics manufacturing in the country could be given a boost through incentivizing exports and positioning India as part of the global value chain. Some topics that were touched upon included MEIS, enhancing the ecosystem of component manufacturing, vocational training, expansion of mega projects, utilization of SEZs, phased manufacturing program for select sectors, introduction of competitive benchmarking, R&D tax benefits, integrating into the global value chain and tax policy recommendations, among other topics.

AMCHAM would prepare a whitepaper to carry the discussions forward. The session was followed by networking over cocktails. The event was sponsored by Flex and Applied Materials.

18th Sept 2019 Defense Committee Meeting

Between 2017 and 2022, the program will reach 83,000 children, 90,000 parents, and 2,900 teachers in 150 government schools across Delhi and Uttarakhand states.

Ms. Ranjana Khanna, Director General CEO, AMCHAM, opened up the session followed by comments from Mr. Phil Shaw, Chairman, AMCHAM and National Executive, Lockheed Martin India. The opening remarks were given by Mr. Michael Koch, Chairman – Defense Committee, AMCHAM and Vice President – India, Boeing Defense, Space and Security, followed by special remarks from USD Lord, while the summing up of the session and closing remarks were given by Mr. Nik Khanna, Co-Chairman – Defense Committee, AMCHAM and Managing Director – India, BAE Systems.

Industry Briefing Post U.S.- India ICT Dialogue

A briefing with AMCHAM members post the U.S.- India ICT Dialogue (held on October 1st) was organized on October 30th at the U.S. Embassy in New Delhi with Mr. Rob Garverick, Honorary USG Co-Chair ICT and Cyber Security Committees, AMCHAM and Minister Counselor for Economic Affairs and Environment, Science and Technology, U.S. Embassy. Mr. Som Satsangi, Chairman – ICT Committee, AMCHAM and Mr. Deepak Maheshwari, Chairman – Cyber Security Committee, AMCHAM, were present.

Mr. Rob Garverick provided inputs from the G2G meeting between the U.S. and Indian government and mentioned thematic areas such as cyber security, implementation of the Cloud Act and MLATs. For ICT, issues such as data localization were discussed, the committee thereby suggested to reach out to the standing committee of Data Privacy and suggest to meet the industry representatives for their inputs. Other topics such as 5G, capacity building initiatives, H1B visas, implementation of AI and IoT in India, were discussed. Mr. Garverick also mentioned that the Indian government would promote local R&D to promote innovation and development in India, such as creation of domestic AI centres. Mr. Som Satsangi raised the point of IP in India and it was decided that the issue would be raised during the committee meeting and the U.S. government would take it up during their G2G meetings. Mr. Deepak Maheshwari spoke of India's stand at the UNGGE and other international forums for cyber security.

4th Nov 2019 Indo-Pacific Business Forum 2019

AMCHAM India supported the U.S. Ambassador's business delegation to the Indo-Pacific Business Forum 2019 led by U.S. Secretary of Commerce, Wilbur Ross on November 4th in Bangkok, Thailand.

6th Nov 2019 2nd CSR Conference: Capacity Building in the CSR Ecosystem

AMCHAM's CSR Committee organized the 2nd CSR Conference: Capacity Building in the CSR Ecosystem that brought together key stakeholders in corporate social responsibility — policymakers, government, corporates, NGOs, social and developmental impact agencies, for cross-sectoral panel discussions that identified and addressed challenges, opportunities and avenues for capacity building in CSR. With the elevation of the current Chairman and his moving back to the U.S., National Executive Board members elected Mr. Karan Bajwa, Managing Director and Regional General Manager India & South Asia, IBM India, as Chairman of AMCHAM. The agenda was taken up for discussion with participation from all members present.

2nd Dec 2019 U.S. Government Bimonthly Briefing

On December 2nd, Honorary National Executive Board Members of AMCHAM, Ms. Aileen Nandi, Minister Counselor Commercial Affairs, U.S. Embassy and Mr. Robert Garverick, Minister Counselor EEST, U.S. Embassy, briefed members on the current state of U.S.-India bilateral relations. Members found the session and candid discussions very useful. Procurement related issues, labour reforms, Data Privacy Bill, price control issues of the medical devices sector, market access issues in agriculture, telecom testing and so forth, were topics discussed and members requested support from the U.S. Embassy on challenges. Going forward AMCHAM would organize similar bimonthly briefings with both Embassy officials and their respective sections.

6th Dec 2019 Pre-Budget Consultation Meeting with Mr. Pramod Chandra Mody, Chairman CBDT, Ministry of Finance

AMCHAM's Taxation, Tariff & Regulatory Affairs Committee consisting of a team from of PwC, KPMG and AMCHAM, attended a meeting chaired by Mr. Pramod Chandra Mody, Chairman CBDT, Ministry of Finance on December 6th to discuss suggestions for Budget 2020-21. A shortlisted set of points from the suggestions already forwarded to Gol were presented by AMCHAM and discussed at the meeting. The Gol has appreciated the suggestions made and will be looking into them.

7th Dec 2019 Annual Christmas Ball

AMCHAM's Annual Christmas Ball was held on December 7th, 2019 at the Hotel ITC Maurya, New Delhi. Honorary President of AMCHAM, Ambassador Kenneth Juster, U.S. Embassy, was the Guest of Honor. Mr. Karan Bajwa, Chairman, AMCHAM and MD & Regional General Manager India & South Asia, IBM India, Mr. Sanjay Koul, Vice Chairman, AMCHAM and Chairman & Managing Director, Timken India Limited and Mr. Atul Dhawan, Honorary Secretary & Treasurer and Chief Strategy Officer, Deloitte, attended the ball. There were a number of officials from the Indian and U.S. governments. Over 200 members and guests participated in the fun filled evening.

9th Dec 2019 ICT Committee Meeting

The 2nd meeting for AMCHAM's Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Committee was commenced on December 9th in New Delhi. It was chaired by Mr. Rob Garverick, Honorary USG Chair - ICT Committee, AMCHAM and Minister Counselor for Economic, Environment, Science and Technology Affairs, U.S. Embassy, Mr. Naveen Tandon, Co-Chairman – ICT Committee, AMCHAM and Mr. Vivek Vasishtha, Co-Chair – ICT Committee, AMCHAM. Members unanimously decided to write a letter to the PMO for the upcoming Personal Data protection bill asking the government to make the draft available to industry and a stakeholder consultation. To get views on the same it was decided a letter to Additional Secretary of PMO, Mr. Arvind Kumar Sharma, be submitted. It was also decided that the Government of India meeting with Meity should be fast tracked for issues wrt National Digital Communications Policy, TRAI Guidelines, digital taxation, intermediary guidelines etc. AMCHAM's ICT Conclave scheduled for March was discussed where HPE showed keen interest to support AMCHAM. The secretariat would work, along with the members, to finalize topic and areas of deliberation.

10th Dec 2019 Corporate TB Pledge Working Group Meeting

On December 10th, AMCHAM organized a meeting for members that have signed the Corporate TB Pledge, an initiative of USAID and the Government of India, that promotes workplace programs to create awareness and align CSR for TB activities and to invest in TB workplace programs. Ms. Ranjana Khanna, Director General CEO, AMCHAM, made opening remarks and mentioned that 32 AMCHAM members had already signed pledge. Mr. Ambrish Bakaya, Co-Chairman – Infrastructure and Smart Cities Committee, AMCHAM and Director Corporate Affairs, Hewlett Packard Enterprise India, spoke about why HPE decided to sign the pledge at the platinum tier and commit to screening 50,000 patients through their 130 e-health centers across 21 states.

Dr. Reuben Swamickan, Division Head of the Tuberculosis and Infectious Diseases Team, USAID/India, said that TB is one of the top 10 causes of death globally and that India is a highest burden country. He emphasized that the TB Pledge was aligned with the GOI's national strategic plan and U.S. government's global TB strategy. Dr. Jamie Tonsing, Director-South East Asia, The Union (the organization that provides technical assistance for the TB Pledge) talked about the uniqueness of the pledge and how India is the first country to try something like it. In the seven months since the pledge was launched The Union has tracked that 100,000+ people have been reached every month with TB messages, around 15,000 symptomatic individuals have been referred for TB testing and more than 1,500 patients were diagnosed with TB referred for treatment.

Members were introduced to the resources and materials they would receive based on each tier of the pledge which included: email samples for HR to use while promoting the pledge, TB policy examples, posters, booklets, employee engagement ideas, a guide for CSR and a healthcare provider ready reckoner, among others. There was an interactive session in which companies shared about what their organizations were doing to carry out their pledge commitment and any challenges they faced. Ms. Kris Easter, USAID/ India, gave the closing remarks and encouraged companies to discuss the pledge with other corporates. The meeting was hosted by Hewlett Packard Enterprise in Gurugram.

11th Dec 2019 Anti-Corruption & FCPA Compliance Committee Webinar on POCA (Prevention of Corruption Act) Guidelines and Enforcement

AMCHAM's Anti-Corruption & FCPA Compliance Committee organized a webinar on 'POCA (Prevention of Corruption Act) Guidelines and Enforcement' on December 11th, 2019. Mr. Ashish Singh, Partner, Dua Associates, was the expert speaker. Ms. Bhawna A. Ranganadhan, Co-Chairperson, Anti-Corruption & FCPA Compliance Committee & Vice President, Legal and Compliance, Genpact, welcomed participants. The webinar was about the Prevention of Corruption Act, governing laws, recent amendments, its implications to MNC's and case studies. Mr. Ashish Singh explained the details about POCA that are applicable to business organizations. In his presentation, he covered the enforcement landscape, risks and preventions with the Act and instances of potential POCA cases faced by corporate houses. Around 75 participants attended the webinar. The webinar concluded with a vote of thanks by AMCHAM India.

12th Dec 2019 Defense Committee Meeting

AMCHAM's Defense Committee met on December 12th, 2019 in New Delhi. The meeting was chaired by Mr. Michael Koch, Chairman – Defense Committee, AMCHAM and Vice President – India, Boeing Defense, Space & Security and co-chaired by Mr. Nik Khanna, Co-Chairman – Defense Committee, AMCHAM and Managing Director, India, BAE Systems and Mr. Gaurav Mehndiratta, Co-Chairman – Defense Committee, AMCHAM and Partner and Head – North India, Corporate & International Tax, KPMG India. From the U.S. Embassy, CAPT Daniel Fillion, Honorary USG Chair – Defense Committee, AMCHAM and Chief, Office of Defense Cooperation, U.S. Embassy, chaired the meeting. AMCHAM welcomed new members, Mr. Guruprasad Mysore, President – India, Honeywell Aerospace and Mr. Monal Shesh, Senior Director – Business Development, GE Aviation. The deliberations began with a brief on recent AMCHAM submissions to the Government of India, upcoming meetings with both governments and future AMCHAM events at DefExpo 2020.

7th Jan 2020 U.S. Government 2+2 Dialogue Debriefing

On December 18, 2019, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar met their American counterparts – Secretary of Defence Mark Esper and Secretary of State Mike Pompeo, respectively, for the second U.S.-India 2+2 Ministerial Dialogue. On January 7th in New Delhi, Mr. Robert Garverick, Minister Counselor EEST, U.S. Embassy and RDML Eileen Laubacher, Defense Attaché, U.S. Embassy, briefed AMCHAM members on the discussions and the current state of U.S.-India bilateral relations. Members found the session very useful.

Under defense cooperation, there was a commitment of the Ministers to expand military-to-military cooperation and improve the defense and security partnership in the coming year. The signing of another defense enabling agreement, Industrial Security Annex (ISA) to facilitate exchange of classified military information between Indian and U.S. defense industries was a high point and the agreement of an annual bi-lateral tri-service amphibious military exercise Tiger Triumph were the key features of the defense discussions. A Statement of Intent to co-develop several projects was also finalized under the Standard Operating Procedure for setting forth implementation guidelines for projects under DTTI and the Industry-to-Industry Framework, which will establish a standing mechanism for dialogue between Indian and U.S. defense companies and their governments on defense technology and industrial cooperation. Both countries have agreed to continue discussions on Basic Exchange and Cooperation Agreement (BECA).

Amongst strategic cooperation, the discussions covered a free and transparent Indo Pacific region, digital connectivity on energy, civil space, potable water and water in agriculture, earth sciences and human space. Enhanced cooperation under the space dialogue and interest for involvement in an U.S.-India Oceans dialogue was also proposed and is under consideration currently. Under the cyber security dialogue in ICT industry covering 5G, mobile technologies, cert responses and cyber practices were discussed. There is possibility of bilateral agreements concerning the U.S. Cloud Act as India expressed interest to be involved in that sphere. The next U.S. – India 2+2 dialogue was confirmed to be held in India in 2020.

13th Jan 2020 Learning Opportunity for MBA Students from Montclair State University

AMCHAM India, in association with KPMG in India, organized a learning opportunity for MBA students from Montclair State University, in Gurgaon on January 13th 2020. Mr. Anuj Vadhera and Mr. Debjit Ghosh of KPMG in India teamed up to conduct an exhilarating session. Participating students had a wonderful opportunity to learn from the speakers' insights and experience on the subject of 'International Business and Strategy in India,' as well as associated opportunities and challenges. Students participated in discussions and interacted with the speakers on a variety of questions which included challenges faced by U.S. investors in India.

22nd Jan 2020 Energy Committee Meeting

A meeting of AMCHAM's Energy Committee was held on January 22nd at the U.S. Embassy and was chaired by Ms. Preetha Nair, Chairperson – Energy Committee, AMCHAM and Head Asia, True North Venture Partners, Mr. Robert Garverick, Honorary USG Chair – Energy Committee, AMCHAM and Minister Counselor for Economic, Environment, Science and Technology Affairs, U.S. Embassy, Ms. Dinah McDougall, Honorary USG Chair – Energy Cooperation Program, AMCHAM and Commercial Officer, U.S. Embassy. The committee deliberated on the agenda and preparation for the upcoming CHT roundtable on February 4th, advocacy for the development of static energy storage, the promotion of energy efficiency through engagement with USAID, Bureau of Energy Efficiency, cooling as a service, etc. It was felt that individual issues of members can be taken up through the fast track mechanism with DPIIT. Best practices in procurement and digital transformation were key areas of common interest to plan future activities.

30th Jan 2020 HR Committee Meeting

AMCHAM's HR Committee met on January 30th in New Delhi with the Labour Code as the theme. Ms. Komple Sharma, Manager, AMCHAM, welcomed speakers and participants to the committee meeting. The opening remarks were delivered by Ms. Kavita Mathur, Co-Chairperson – HR Committee, AMCHAM and People & Culture Leader, Grant Thornton Advisory. It was followed by an interactive session and panel discussion on the Labour Code. The panellists were Dr. Anoop K Satpathy, Senior Faculty, V. V. Giri National Labour Institute and Mr. K.C Pandey, Consultant, Grant Thornton India LLP. The discussion was moderated by Mr. Akhil Chandna, Director, Tax, Grant Thornton India LLP. Dr. Satpathy gave a detailed presentation on the key features of the Labour Code focusing on its background and key problem areas, wage policy reforms in wage code and its likely impact. He also touched upon the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, Code on Industrial Relations and Code on Social Security. It was followed by a discussion session. Ms. Kavita Mathur expressed her gratitude to the speakers and gave the closing remarks.

Members were updated on the recent opening of the Development Finance Corporation (DFC), an independent agency of the U.S. Government that provides financing for private development projects. Members found the candid session beneficial and the next briefing was scheduled for March 26th.

3rd Feb 2020 Taxation, Tariff & Regulatory Affairs Committee's Webinar on Budget 2020

On February 3rd, AMCHAM's Taxation, Tariff & Regulatory Affairs Committee, in association with PwC, conducted a webinar on the key aspects of Union Budget 2020. This webinar examined highlights of the Union Budget presented in Parliament on February 1st. Direct and indirect tax implications, as well as salient features that impact the economy in general and business of U.S. companies were discussed. The trends envisaged based on extensive analysis of the budget were explored to see they would impact

business. Approximately 40 participants logged into the webinar. A variety of queries posted during the webinar were answered on the spot. The speakers included: Mr. Sandeep Chaufla, Chairman – Taxation, Tariff & Regulatory Affairs Committee, AMCHAM and Partner – Corporate and International Tax, PwC India, Ms. Anita Rastogi, Partner – Indirect Tax and GST, PwC India and Mr. Manish Sabharwal, Partner – Transfer Pricing, PwC India.

4th Feb 2020 Centre for High Technology (CHT) Roundtable on Energy & Petrochemicals

AMCHAM organized a roundtable with the Centre for High Technology (CHT, MoP&NG) on energy and petrochemicals on February 4th in New Delhi under the leadership of Mr. Sunil Kumar, Joint Secretary Refinery, MoP&NG and Mr. K.K Jain, Executive Director, CHT. The purpose of the meeting was to enhance U.S.-India trade and technology collaboration in the energy sector. The CHT graciously hosted the leadership of AMCHAM's Energy Committee: Ms. Preetha Nair, Chairperson – Energy Committee, AMCHAM and Head Asia, True North Venture Partners, Mr. Robert Garverick, Honorary USG Chair – Energy Committee, AMCHAM and Minister Counselor for Economic, Environment, Science and Technology Affairs, U.S. Embassy, Ms. Dinah McDougall, Honorary USG Chair – Energy Cooperation Program, AMCHAM and Commercial Officer, U.S. Embassy, senior executives of American energy companies and senior U.S. government officials for a roundtable discussion with senior executives from National Oil Companies (NOCs). After the keynote address on priority areas and expectations by CHT, presentations were made by 11 U.S. companies on CO2 to chemicals/carbon capture and utilization, niche petrochemicals, refinery and petrochemical integration, bio-fuels, water management solutions, automation solutions, EPCM, etc. This was followed by Q&A where executives from NOCs sought clarifications from the presenters. The roundtable was concluded with a vote of thanks from the Joint Secretary and networking over light refreshments.

4th Feb 2020 U.S. Industry Roundtable with U.S. Government Officials at DefExpo 2020

On February 4th in Lucknow, a remarkable U.S. government delegation led by Ambassador Kenneth Juster comprising of Mr. Terence Emmert, Principal Deputy Director of Defense Research and Engineering for Advanced Capabilities (PD, DDRE (AC)), Department of Defense, MG Daniel McDaniel, Deputy Commanding General, United States Army Pacific (USARPAC), Australian Army and RDML Eileen Laubacher, Defense Attaché, U.S. Embassy, interacted with the U.S. industry participants. The ongoing dialogue between the U.S. and India in aerospace and defense sectors would likely open up new business opportunities. The sharing of information to further strengthen partnerships in the areas of development and co-production of high-end defense technology and equipment was discusses. U.S. and Indian companies have been collaborating in the co-production of C-130 transport aircraft, F-16 fighter planes, and Apache helicopters at joint facilities in Hyderabad. Companies were happy to share information with the U.S. government principals and sought their support on many points in implementation with the Indian government processes.

4th Feb 2020 Defense Industry Reception with U.S. Government Officials at DefExpo 2020

U.S. industry participants joined other industry participants at a reception in honor of the exhibitors and participants at DefExpo 2020. The guest of honor was Ambassador Kenneth Juster, U.S. Embassy. The welcome remarks were given by Mr. Salil Gupte, National Executive Board Member, AMCHAM and President, Boeing India followed by special remarks by RDML Eileen Laubacher, Defense Attaché, U.S. Embassy, while Mr. Phil Shaw, Director Business Development, Lockheed Martin International, gave the vote of thanks and opened up the reception to all the participants. The event, held on February 4th in Lucknow, was jointly hosted with USISPF and USIBC with support from partners like BAE Systems, Boeing, Honeywell, L3Harris, Lockheed Martin, Northrop Grumman, Raytheon, Textron and Kallman Worldwide.

6th Feb 2020

Meeting with Dr. Ajay Kumar, Defence Secretary, Ministry of Defence, Government of India at DefExpo 2020

AMCHAM Defense Committee members called upon Dr. Ajay Kumar at the Ministry of Defence Pavilion at DefExpo 2020 on Febreuary 6th to understand his vison of "Make in India" and the defense corridors.

14th Feb 2020 Make in India – Manufacturing for the World

AMCHAM, in partnership with Invest India, held 'Make in India – Manufacturing for the World' on February 14th in New Delhi. It was the signature event of AMCHAM's Manufacturing Committee. Chief guest, Mr. Hardeep Singh Puri, Minister of State (Independent Charge) of Civil Aviation, Housing and Urban Affairs, Minister of State for Commerce & Industry, Government of India, gave the keynote address, in which he gave an overview of the widening and deepening cooperation between the U.S. and India across a vast number of areas such as counter-terrorism, homeland security, cybersecurity, science and technology, health, agriculture, etc. Minister Puri talked about growing urbanisation and construction activity citing that 100 smart cities were under development which included 5,151 projects, thus demonstrating the fast pace of development in smart cities. He mentioned that integration into the global value chains would require strategic decisions to be made and the scaling up of manufacturing to meet global demand. Overall, he expressed optimism on the growth of U.S – India economic relationship and a willingness to resolve issues impacting bilateral business.

The inaugural session began with welcome remarks by Ms. Ranjana Khanna, Director General CEO, AMCHAM, wherein she mentioned that exports would be a key driver for expansion in India's manufacturing as the world realizes that an alternate manufacturing hub was needed even more so in the current scenario with disruptions to the global supply chain. Mr. Sanjay Koul, Vice Chairman, AMCHAM and Chairman – Manufacturing Committee, AMCHAM and Chairman & Managing Director, Timken India, set the scene for the event and emphasized India's target to be a \$5 trillion economy in 5 years with a 25% share of manufacturing which would contribute \$1 trillion to the GDP.

In his special remarks and with KPMG as the knowledge partner for the event, Mr. Akhil Bansal, Deputy CEO, KPMG in India, said the foundation for a \$5 trillion economy included reviving consumption, creating jobs in labour intensive industries, moving towards tech certainty and improving competitiveness. In the vote of thanks, Mr. Arijit Sen, Co-Chairman – Manufacturing Committee, AMCHAM and Senior Director, Global Government Affairs & Public Policy, Flex Group, thanked the government for its commitment to the Make in India program. AMCHAM presented a memento to Minister Hardeep Singh Puri.

The participants proceeded to attend one of the parallel breakout sessions on I) smart infrastructure and electric vehicles, II) agriculture and food processing or III) electronic hardware and mobiles.

Breakout Session I:

Smart Infrastructure and Electric Vehicles

In 'Breakout Session I: Smart Infrastructure and Electric Vehicles' Mr. Manuj Ohri, Partner, KPMG in India, set the scene emphasizing that infrastructure was the driving force behind business today and Mr. Sanjay Koul, Chairman – Manufacturing Committee, AMCHAM and Chairman & Managing Director, Timken India Limited was the conversation facilitator. Mr. Gaurav Daga, Vice President, Guidance Bureau, Government of Tamil Nadu and Ms. Shefali Rai, Policy Specialist, Tamil Nadu Guidance Bureau (TNGB) made a presentation on the Electric Vehicle Policy of the state as well as discussed at length their views on the initiatives offered, avenues available and challenges faced in the EV sector. From Invest India, Mr. Nehal Bajwa, Mr. Ayush Pagaria and Mr. Shivam Batham were present.

Industry speakers at the roundtable included Mr. Samit Ray, Co-Chairman – Infrastructure & Smart Cities Committee, AMCHAM and Regional Director – Government Affairs & Public Policy South East Asia, United Technologies Corporation, Mr. Naveen Tandon, Co-Chairman – ICT Committee, AMCHAM and Director – International External Affairs, AT&T, Ms. Swati Sinha, General Manager – North India, C.H. Robinson Worldwide Freight India, Ms. Deepa Das, Lead Legal Counsel, Legal & Regulatory Affairs, FedEx Express Middle East, Indian Subcontinent and Africa, Mr. Debashish Dutta, Head Smart Cities, Hewlett Packard Enterprise, Mr. Biswajit Bhattacharya, Partner & Automotive Industry Leader – India S/Asia, GBS, IBM India, Mr. Harish Sharma, Commercial Applied Stream, Marketing & Product Management Leader – India & SAARC Markets, Ingersoll Rand, Mr. Jon Pickford, Director Smart Buildings/Cities and Integrated Developments,

APAC, Johnson Controls, Ms. Geeta Poduval, Director – Corporate Affairs, Progress Rail India, Mr. Rakesh Mishra, Country Head & Director, Sate-Lite Technologies and Mr. Santhosh Muzumdar, Head Business Development Govt Affairs, Johnson Controls.

Deliberations focused on regional airports and connectivity, infrastructural requirements for smart cities, India as the world's 3rd largest auto market in 2021, innovating and implementing the future of mobility from/ in India and global best practices for adoption of new technologies. Other topics discussed included end to end policy for EVs, urban planning which includes last mile connectivity, infrastructure development around industrial units and IoT challenges around current requirements to get multiple approvals which slows the pace of adoption of such technologies.

Breakout Session II:

Agriculture and Food Processing

Ms. Komple Sharma, Manager, AMCHAM India welcomed participants to 'Breakout Session II: Agriculture and Food Processing.' Mr. Rajeev Ranjan, Director, KPMG in India was the conversation facilitator for the session. Mr. Srinivas Kuchibotla, Partner, KPMG in India set the scene and talked about the key role FPOs plays in the agricultural supply chain, post harvesting requirements like digitization, E-Nam, etc. He also touched upon the increasing thrust on attracting investments in the food processing sector.

In his special remarks, Dr. J.P. Mishra, ADG, ICAR, Govt. of India enumerated the initiatives taken by the Indian government in doubling the farmers income. He spoke about the cyber agro physical system that will help in AI based advisory to farmers. He also shared how water has taken a central stage in Indian context and agriculture being one of main users of fresh waters, hence the aim is to create an eco-system where water usage goes down by 75%. Dr. Mishra also spoke on the land tenancy problem where resource pooling and FPOs were emerging as the most feasible solution. The government is also promoting digital agriculture through its chain of Krishi Vigyan Kendras. He also pitched for greater collaboration between the government and the private platers especially in the food processing sector. Mr. Sanjay Dave, Former Chairperson, Codex Alimenatrius Commission, stressed on the uniformity between global and Indian safety standards and advocated for its implementation from the farm fields itself. He discussed the advantages of adopting GAP (good agricultural practices), GMP, GPS, etc. especially in bringing more value to exports. He also asked for an upgradation in the current agri schemes and processes.

Industry speakers included: Mr. Pankaj Mahajan, Director-Indian Subcontinent, Corporate Affairs, Cargill India, Ms. Reena Bhattacharya, Communication Head, Cargill India, Mr. Rahul Kapoor, GM (Sales & Marketing), Carrier Airconditioning & Refrigeration Limited, Mr. Anaam Sharma, Senior Manager – Corporate Affairs, Coca-Cola India, Ms. Neeru Ahuja, Partner – Tax Business, Deloitte, Mr. Ankur Malhotra, Head, Government Relations, Hewlett Packard Enterprise, Mr. Amit Mehta, Managing Director, McCormick India, Mr. Shashikanth Bhende, Country Agronomist and Product Manager, Mosaic, Mr. Vishal Dutta, Head of Research & Partnerships, Sannam S4, Mr. Subhash Pattnaik, Regional Head-Precision Agril, South Asia, Trimble, Mr. Anand Vijay Jha, Vice President and Head Corporate Affairs, Public Policy, Communications and Sustainability, Walmart India, Ms. Salonie Chawla, Consultant, APCO Worldwide India, Mr. Love Kumar, General Manager, Sales, Tecumseh Products India and Dr. Jasvir Singh, Regulatory, Scientific & Government Affairs Leader – South Asia, DuPont. Mr. Sarabpreet Singh Bedi, Executive Director from NAFED and Ms. Radha Mani, Agricultural Assistant from the U.S. Embassy in India were present. From Invest India, Vivek Sonny Abraham and Aayushi Bhatia attended.

The participants discussed five broad areas – AgriTech and its implications, the need for robust agricultural infrastructure, importance of global standards of quality, the growth of food processing industry and marketing and branding of agri produce in India. The key points discussed included the role of FPOs, convergence of all agriculture related schemes, need for greater interventions by the government in AgriTech, rationalization of certain custom duties on imported agri technology, digitization of agricultural land, standardization of agricultural infrastructure and the inherited demand – supply gap, absence of global standards of quality, obsolete schemes and the dire need to adopt sustainable practices. Industry felt

that any scheme, incentive or policy drafted should take into consideration the entire value chain i.e. from the famers to the end consumers.

Breakout Session III:

Electronic Hardware and Mobiles

In 'Breakout Session III: Electronic Hardware and Mobiles' Mr. Dipayan Ghosh, Executive Director, KPMG in India, set the scene through discussing on export oriented growth for component manufacturing and the successes Vietnam in this regard. He touched on patents and the need for standards to be in line with the global system. Mr. Arijit Sen, Co-Chairman – Manufacturing Committee, AMCHAM and Senior Director, Global Government Affairs & Public Policy, Flex Group was the conversation facilitator. Mr. S.K. Marwaha, Senior Director/Scientist 'G,' Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, discussed some of the ease of doing business challenges and policy updates on the horizon. From Invest India Mr. Shawn Bhalla and Mr. Ehtesham Khurshid talked about a study they conducted where they have found out that the disabilities in the electronic manufacturing sector was roughly about 8-10%. They encouraged American firms to share their investment plans in India for a manufacturing hub delivering to markets globally.

Industry speakers for the session included: Mr. Ambrish Bakaya, Co-Chairman – Infrastructure & Smart Cities Committee, AMCHAM and Director Corporate Affairs, Hewlett Packard Enterprise, Mr. Tabrez Ahmad, Group Director, Government Affairs & Public Policy, Dell, Mr. Sumeet Hemkar, Partner | Tax, Deloitte, Mr. Kapil Madhok, Country Manager – Air Services, India, Bangladesh & Sri Lanka, Expeditors International (India), Mr. Harjinder Singh, Country Manager – Customs Compliance & Services India, Bangladesh, Expeditors International (India), Ms. Anita Wadhwa Bhardwaj, Managing Director, Sales, FedEx Express Middle East Indian Subcontinent and Africa and Ms. Anubhuti Bhrany, Head Government Relations, India, HP India.

Some of the points of discussion included the possibility to extend the incentives under SEZs to provide a thrust to the sector, incentives for R&D facilities in India, potential for an industry led task force, strategy for export led growth of electronics, developments in the Phased Manufacturing Program, policy requirements for the growth of component ecosystem for electronics, skill development for high tech operations, time delays at customs for shipments and opportunities in fab labs.

The Road Ahead

Post the sector specific breakout sessions, all participants gathered back together for a plenary session on 'The Road Ahead' with opening remarks by Mr. Nitin Atroley, Chairman – Economic Affairs Committee, AMCHAM and Office Managing Partner – North, KPMG in India. He emphasized the pertinent flagship programs of the government, Make in India and the Assemble in India, with the objective of increasing share in global trade to 3.5% and a target GDP of \$5 trillion. He talked about the need for improving competitiveness of Indian manufacturing, taking advantage of the geo-political situation and bold policy initiatives to catapult manufacturing.

The Breakout Session Takeaways were summarized by Mr. Sanjay Koul, Chairman – Manufacturing Committee, AMCHAM and Chairman & Managing Director, Timken India Limited for Smart Infrastructure and Electric Vehicles, Mr. Arijit Sen, Co-Chairman – Manufacturing Committee, AMCHAM and Senior Director, Global Government Affairs & Pubic Policy, Flex Group for Electronic Hardware and Mobiles and Mr. Srinivas Kuchibotla, Partner, KPMG in India for Agriculture and Food Processing. KPMG have prepared a whitepaper on the deliberations and recommendations.

Mr. Deepak Bagla, Managing Director & CEO, Invest India, in his special address said 8 U.S. companies have been operating in India for over 100 years, the foundation of the oldest business relationship. Invest India is looking at 662 active business opportunities for U.S. investments into India with the number of sectors of interest has increased from 11 to 27 sectors. He said Jal Jeevan Mission offered a \$51 billion opportunity for U.S. companies and highlighted innovation and start-ups as pillars supporting the U.S.-India relationship.

In his special address, Mr. Sudhanshu Pandey, Additional Secretary, Department of Commerce, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, mentioned that although the trade deal between both countries was still a work in progress, confidence was growing step by step. He said the Commerce & Industry Ministry was meeting regularly to address issues related to India's competitiveness in manufactured products and services. He emphasized that India was working on globalization index to support manufacturing, services, etc. towards meeting global acceptability through harmonization of standards. While discussing the global shortage of healthcare workers he said Ayushman Bharat offered a big investment opportunity across the healthcare sector in India. The session concluded with Ms. Ranjana Khanna, Director General CEO, AMCHAM presenting a momento to Mr. Pandey and thanking Flex for supporting the event.

18th Feb 2020 Meeting with Congressman Ami Bera and Congressman George Holding

On February 18th in New Delhi, Congressman Ami Bera, Chair of the House Foreign Affairs Subcommittee on Asia, the Pacific and Non-Proliferation and Democratic Co-Chair of the India Caucus in the U.S. Congress and Congressman George Holding, the Republican Co-Chair of the India Caucus, met with AMCHAM members in the defense and healthcare sectors during an AMCHAM-USIBC joint closed door roundtable. Members shared with the Congressmen their growing concerns in the sectors and sought support in getting the concerns heard through the right channels. Both lawmakers promised bipartisan support to growing ties between India and the U.S. in diverse areas including trade and commerce, defense and strategic affairs. They also shared positivity in the hopes of India and the U.S. sealing the much anticipated trade deal soon.

20th Feb 2020 Anti-Corruption & FCPA Compliance Core Committee Meeting

On February 20th, the Anti-Corruption & FCPA Compliance Core Committee organized a meeting at the BAE Systems India (Services) Private Limited office in New Delhi. Ms. Komple Sharma, Manager, AMCHAM, welcomed participants. Opening remarks were given by Mr. Gaurav Ajmani, Chairman – Anti-Corruption & FCPA Compliance Committee, AMCHAM and Associate General Counsel: Business Conduct & Ethics, Amazon Seller Services (P) Ltd. The committee deliberated upon the two most common pain areas for any compliance manager – vendor compliance management and third party risks. They shared their respective industry risks and the need for continuous monitoring of third parties. Members brainstormed on various possible topics for future discussions under the ambit of the committee. The closing remarks and vote of thanks were given by Mr. Gaurav Ajmani.

20th Feb 2020 Release of 'India at \$5 Trillion: Strengthening Opportunities, Removing Hurdles'

On February 20th, AMCHAM and Observer Research Foundation (ORF) released the first study on U.S. industry before President Trump's visit to India. The study 'India at \$5 Trillion: Strengthening Opportunities, Removing Hurdles' was based on interactions with AMCHAM members and has examined the investment potential and market opportunities that India's growth offers, opportunities for U.S. companies as a business partner in India's growth and hurdles U.S. companies face while doing business in India.

The study was officially released by Mr. Hardeep Singh Puri, Minister of State (Independent Charge) of Civil Aviation, Housing and Urban Affairs, Minister of State for Commerce and Industry, Government of India. Welcome remarks were made by Ms. Tanushree Chandra, Junior Fellow – Economy and Growth Programme, ORF. Ms. Ranjana Khanna, Director General CEO, AMCHAM, provided background to the study and highlighted how U.S. companies have partnered in India's growth story in her opening remarks. Mr. Gautam Chikermane, Vice President, ORF, in his remarks, outlined five key pillars to the U.S.-India partnership to be values, capitalism, markets, strategy and defense.

Minister Puri, in his address, gave an overview and history of the U.S.-India partnership. He said that the report was a testimony that the business environment in India is positive and was enthusiastic that India could be a \$10 trillion economy by 2030. He highlighted many government initiatives that illustrated India's growth at a rapid speed and touched upon challenges that affect the ease of doing business in India, as mentioned in the report.

20th Feb 2020 Medical Technology Working Group Meeting

AMCHAM's Medical Technology Working group meeting was held on February 20th at New Delhi under the chairmanship of Ms. Aileen Nandi, Honorary USG Chairperson – Healthcare Committee, AMHCAM and Minister Counselor for Commercial Affairs, U.S. Embassy and Ms. Meenakshi Nevatia, Chairperson – Healthcare Services Committee, AMCHAM and Managing Director, Stryker India. The meeting encompassed discussions on pricing, standards, Make in India and data protection, along with an update on the advocacy and regulatory landscape for medical devices. Members pointed out the current situation of the medtech industry along with a few issues based on pricing frame work, standards, Make in India and regulatory challenges. Members enquired about opportunities to provide comments on Section 301 and whether the U.S. government plans to engage to seek comments from members. Based on the issues discussed during the meeting, members decided to meet Indian government officials in the coming month along with a position paper. The meeting concluded with closing remarks thanking the members for their valuable inputs.

21th Feb 2020 Defense Committee Meeting

AMCHAM's Defense Committee met on February 21st in New Delhi. The meeting was chaired by Mr. Nik Khanna, Co-Chairman – Defense Committee, AMCHAM and Managing Director, India, BAE Systems and Mr. Gaurav Mehndiratta, Co-Chairman – Defense Committee, AMCHAM and Partner and Head – North India, Corporate & International Tax, KPMG India. From the U.S. Embassy, CAPT Daniel Fillion, Honorary USG Chair – Defense Committee, AMCHAM and Chief, Office of Defense Cooperation, U.S. Embassy, chaired the meeting. The deliberations began with a brief on the success of AMCHAM events at DefExpo 2020. Upcoming AMCHAM engagements and agendas with the Government of India, USG and other near term collaborations were also discussed.

25th Feb 2020 AMCHAM – ICRIER Brainstorming Interaction: U.S.-India Economic Partnership

To welcome U.S. President Donald Trump's visit to India, AMCHAM in association with Indian Council for Research on International Economic Relations (ICRIER) organized a brainstorming session on the U.S.-India economic partnership on February 25th in New Delhi. The panel included Mr. Sanjay Chadha, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India, Mr. Atul Dhawan, Honorary Secretary & Treasurer, AMCHAM and Partner, Deloitte, Prof. Anwarul Hoda, Chair Professor of ICRIER's Trade Policy and WTO Research Program, Dr. Arpita Mukherjee, Professor, ICRIER and Ms. Ranjana Khanna, Director General CEO, AMCHAM. Dr. Rajat Kathuria, Director and Chief Executive, ICRIER was the moderator for the discussion.

Dr. Rajat Kathuria welcomed panelists and in his opening remarks highlighted that U.S.-India relations were at an all-time high and expressed desire that the visit by the U.S. President would lay a foundation for an FTA between India and the U.S. in the near future. Prof. Anwarul Hoda, in his remarks mentioned that the findings and recommendations by the Private Sector Advisory Group (PSAG) set up in 2007 to get industry feedback on the measures needed to improve bilateral trade and investment relations between the U.S. and India were never implemented in their full stride. Mr. Sanjay Chadha, in his remarks, pointed out that the trade deficit between India and the U.S. is gradually decreasing and also mentioned that the conventional calculation of bilateral trade excludes defense purchases, and when added, the deficit becomes narrower. He also told the participants that convergence towards issues have emerged but due to the interlinkages of the economies new issues crop up. The discussion saw wide ranging topics being discussed and questions, Indo-Iran relations, requirements of the American companies to become a part of the supply chain, progress made in sectors like medical technology and agriculture and the role of MSMEs amongst others. Ms. Ranjana Khanna in her vote of thanks expressed gratitude towards the panelists and ICRIER.

25th Feb 2020 AMCHAM – IDSA Brainstorming Interaction on the U.S.-India Defense Partnership

AMCHAM and IDSA (Manohar Parrikar Institute for Defence Studies and Analyses) conducted a brainstorming interaction on the U.S.-India defense partnership with defense experts and U.S. industry members on February 25th in New Delhi. The discussions were under Chatham House rules. Defense is the key driver of the U.S.-India bilateral partnership. India and the U.S. have made considerable progress to push forth the bilateral defense cooperation and continues to have a favorable future outlook. As a major supplier of defense and aerospace products to India, the U.S. is keen to look for a way forward in meeting India's needs and aspirations of achieving self-reliance. AMCHAM members participated and senior officials from the services were present during the much engaging and open discussion. Mr. Gaurav Mehndiratta, Co-Chairman – Defense Committee, AMCHAM and Partner and Head – North India, Corporate and International Tax, KPMG, gave a brief presentation on the U.S. defense scenario. Ambassador Sujan R. Chinoy, Director General, IDSA, co-chaired the proceedings with Ms. Ranjana Khanna, Director General CEO, AMCHAM.

26th Feb 2020 Defense Committee Meeting with Mr. Raj Kumar, Secretary, Defence Production, Ministry of Defence, Government of India

AMCHAM's Defense Committee leadership and senior defense committee members called upon Secretary Defence Production, Mr. Raj Kumar, at his office on February 26th. The Secretary shared his vision with the team on issues ranging from offsets (credits and multipliers), procurement and banking. The team offered to submit detailed notes on our recommendations for the department's consideration.

4th Mar 2020 National Executive Board Meeting

The fourth meeting of AMCHAM's National Executive Board for 2019-2020 was held on March 4th, 2020 in Bengaluru. Consul General Robert Burgess, U.S. Consulate General Chennai, addressed board members on the U.S-India partnership and recent visit of President Trump. Mr. Sanjay Koul, Vice Chairman, AMCHAM and Chairman & Managing Director, Timken India Limited, chaired the meeting. The agenda was taken up for discussion with participation from all members present.

5th Mar 2020 Interaction with Jon M. Huntsman School of Business Students

AMCHAM's Karnataka Chapter organized an interaction with the visiting business honors students from the Jon M. Huntsman School of Business, Utah on March 5th. Mr. Sanjay Mujoo, Vice President, Pointnext Services Global Delivery Center – Hewlett Packard Enterprise, interacted with students and gave them a brief on how the tech sector in India has evolved especially in Karnataka, where Hewlett Packard is now in their contribution to technology development and where they are headed. The conversation touched upon some of the challenges faced by the society and how industry is able to generate demand for tech sector innovation and offerings. The event was very well received by the students, most of whom were in India for the first time.

20th Mar 2020 CSR Committee Meeting

AMCHAM's CSR Committee held a committee meeting on March 20th through Webex. Mr. Harish Krishnan, Chairman – CSR Committee, AMCHAM and Managing Director, Public Affairs & Strategic Engagements, Cisco India & SAARC, Cisco Systems (India), welcomed participants and encouraged members during these abnormal times. He mentioned the Prime Minister's crowd sourcing for fixes regarding COVID-19 and asked companies to send in their suggestions. Ms. Kshitija Krishnaswamy, Co-Chairperson – CSR Committee, AMCHAM and Director, Corporate Citizenship, Accenture India, emphasized that companies need to stay in communication with one another as CSR programs will get greatly affected during this time. Ms. Sangita Ghalay, Co-Chairperson – CSR Committee, AMCHAM and Head – CSR, Honeywell India, asked members to send their inputs on the new CSR policy amendment rules so that AMCHAM can make a collective representation to the government.

The meeting explored how American companies can help with CSR initiatives to mitigate impact of COVID-19. USAID talked about the need to spread awareness on the virus at the workplace. The U.S. government has made the virus a priority and they would soon share specific ways that members can partner with civil society and government to combat COVID-19. It became evident that there are limited NGOs working specifically on COVID-19 and that AMCHAM would help gather info about it.

Mr. Jay Badola, Partner, Dua Associates and Mr. Akash Nath, Partner, Dua Associates, answered questions on the Draft Companies (Corporate Social Responsibility Policy) Amendment Rules, 2020, which were open for comment through March 28th. Members recommended the reinstatement of trusts and societies for accepting CSR funds. The Q&A also addressed the disclosure of CSR policy and committee members on company websites, whether any long-term, multi-year program need to be truncated and the removal of "contribution to corpus," among other topics. Mr. Harish Krishnan, in his closing comments, thanked Dua Associates for their expert insights and mentioned, while the date for the annual CSR Conference was unknown, it would surely take place later in the year.

26th Mar 2020 U.S. Government Bimonthly Briefing

On March 26th, AMCHAM's Honorary National Executive Board Members, Ms. Aileen Nandi, Minister Counselor Commercial Affairs, U.S. Embassy and Mr. Robert Garverick, Minister Counselor EEST, U.S. Embassy, briefed members amidst concerns arising out of the outbreak of COVID-19 and the ensuing governmental lockdown over a conference call. More than 40 members participated in call. Ms. Ranjana Khanna, Director General CEO, AMCHAM, introduced both speakers. Post their opening remarks, the participants raised issues and sought clarifications and interventions to their present challenges related to COVID-19 ranging from exemptions from lockdowns and temporary closures based on essential business services.

Ms. Aileen Nandi, in response to a question raised about employees being stranded in the U.S. with their visa/permits running out, encouraged them to check out U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) for more details. Mr. Rob Garverick encouraged all U.S. citizens to sign up for Smart Traveler Enrolment Program (STEP), a free service that allows U.S. citizens traveling abroad to enroll with the local U.S. Embassy or Consulate to get regular security updates. The USG update on the COVID-19 situation and any impact they perceive from a trade perspective, with focus on overall economy, particularly life sciences, pharma sector, banking and financial services, supply chain and transportation, was also discussed. It was proposed to set up similar conference calls for all regions with the U.S. Consulates so that issues could be addressed locally quickly.

27th Mar 2020 COVID-19 in India – Updates and Strategies: An HR Perspective

In the wake of COVID-19 and its massive impact on businesses, in particular HR aspects, AMCHAM's HR Committee, in collaboration with Sannam S4, organized an interactive webinar on 'COVID-19 in India – Updates and Strategies: An HR Perspective' on March 27th. The panelists included Ms. Susmita Sen, Head of HR Advisory, Sannam S4, Mr. Abhinav Sood, Head of Client Relations & International Projects-Financial Consulting, Sannam S4 and Ms. Ranjana Khanna, Director General CEO, AMCHAM. The webinar focused on pertinent issues like retrenchment, appraisals, employee motivation and engagements, leadership and remote working situations, amongst others. The panelists touched upon important points needed in the prevailing challenging times. They informed participants about the three pillars as dictated by the International Labor Organization – protecting workforce, stimulating economy and supporting jobs. They also spoke about the importance of proper appraisals that should be done in isolation from the present timeframe and the importance of identifying key performers. The importance of proper documentation and compliance was also brought up during the discussion. The leaders were asked to show dynamism in this rapidly changing scenario. Issues and challenges in remote working were discussed along with some suggestive measures to overcome them. Around 80 participants attended the webinar. The webinar concluded with a vote of thanks by AMCHAM India and Sannam S4.

30th Mar 2020 Taxation, Tariff & Regulatory Affairs Committee Meeting

AMCHAM's Taxation, Tariff & Regulatory Affairs Committee met over a con-call on March 30th to discuss steps to be taken towards discussions with members and possible representation from AMCHAM on the new Equalisation Levy proposed in Finance Act 2020. The discussion was led by Mr. Naveen Agarwal, Designate Chairman – Taxation, Tariff & Regulatory Affairs Committee, AMCHAM and Partner International Tax and Partner in Charge U.S. Corridor, KPMG in India and Ms. Neeru Ahuja, Designate Co-Chairperson – Taxation, Tariff & Regulatory Affairs Committee, AMCHAM and Partner – Global Business Tax, Deloitte Haskins & Sells. The committee decided to make a representation to the Hon'ble Finance Minister bringing out concerns of AMCHAM members on the issue of Equalisation Levy. The committee also decided to host a webinar for members on this issue as well as other Finance Act 2020 points. Representation to the Finance Minister has since been made.

31st Mar 2020 A Dialogue with Mr. Kamlesh Varshney, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Finance, Government of India and EY Tax Partners to Discuss the Recent Amendments in the Finance Bill 2020 w.r.t to 'Key Amendments in the Finance Bill 2020: Extension of Scope of Equalization Levy to Cover e-Commerce Supply or Services

On March 31st, AMCHAM India collaborated with EY India on a dialogue between Mr. Kamlesh Varshney, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Finance, Government of India and EY Tax partners to discuss the recent amendments in the Finance Bill 2020 w.r.t to 'Key Amendments in the Finance Bill 2020: Extension of Scope of Equalization Levy to Cover E-Commerce Supply or Services' (via concall). The session commenced with EY India welcoming participants on the call and setting the stage for the discussion. Through his remarks Mr. Kamlesh Varshney, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Finance, Government of India, shared insights on the scope of the Equalization Levy which will cover e-commerce supply or services w.e.f. 1st April 2020. The Q&A session addressed key concerns of companies with regards the Equalization Levy. In his final comments Mr. Varshney stated that further updates and clarifications on the Equalization Levy would be shared by the Government of India.

Consul General Joel Reifman was the guest of honor and he said the theme of the conference was in line with the U.S-India partnership of providing accessibility and affordability healthcare both in the urban and rural areas. Mr. Kaivaan Movdawalla of Ernst & Young showcased the healthcare delivery landscape in India and the three key imperatives to provide universal healthcare to all. He spoke on the rising dual disease burden – communicable diseases and non-communicable diseases.

The first panel 'Sustainable Healthcare Delivery Models to Ensure Inclusiveness' had panellists from various walks of life with Mr. Movdawalla of EY as the moderator. The panellists were Mr. Sarang Deo, ISB, Mr. NS Vishwanath, Mfine, Mr. Hari Thalapalli, Call Health and Mr. Ambuj Chaturvedi, Medtronic. They discussed how technology would give more options and the qualitative factor was more important than the quantitative factor. It is not about price control only but also about process and quality control. Challenges include information asymmetry, quality of care and customer behaviour. Medical support and capability can be achieved only through technology. Technology is an important way to bridge access to rural areas and help in continuity of care.

In the second session 'Patient Centric Models,' Mr. Srikanth Potturi, EY, moderated. The panellists were Dr. Pramod Gaddam, Fernandez Foundation (dealt with challenges), Mr. Matruprasad P, Medtronic (dealt with the technology aspect) and Mr. Murali Rao, EY (dealt with privacy issues in a patient centric model). A patient centric model is about keeping the patient in the centre, lowering costs and getting the best medical outcomes. Technology enables us to connect all stakeholders. Technology has been an enabler but patient privacy is important. Empathy for the patients was stressed.

The webinar featured the following speakers: Mr. Jayesh Ranjan IAS, (IT & Industries), Mr. VC Sajjanar IPS, (Cyberabad Commissioner of Police) and Dr. G Srinivasa Rao (Public Health Dept.) in conversation with Mr. Viiveck Verma, Board Member of TiE Hyderabad. was held on March 27th from 3:00 p.m. onwards. The webinar started off with Mr. Viiveck Verma introducing the panelists. Dr. G Srinivasa Rao, Director, Public Health Dept, Govt of Telangana, said that of the 47 cases 35 were cured. There were about 1,600 foreign returnees and the lockdown has been initiated to break the chain of transmission. He said that things were under control now and being closely monitored.

Mr. Jayesh Ranjan said that 95% of the IT workforce was working from home and the remaining 5% were given passes for the critical resources they handle. The SCSC could be contacted for passes and after due verification, the passes would be issued by the concerned officer. Broadband uptake has gone up by at least 30%. All four carriers have identified high demand areas and willing to work with the neighborhoods to get the additional infrastructure up and running. There seems no major complaints about broadband speeds. DSCI cybersecurity would be working on strengthening security.

Mr. V C Sajjanar requested members to abide by the rules and ensure that public do their shopping for groceries etc. only within the 3 km range of their residence, that was specified. He also requested that others stay at home and stay safe. A COVID-19 control room has been set up and public could contact them for anything. He request the public not to panic but follow the instructions of the Healthcare Department and take whatever precautions needed.

Ms. Amada Kidwai, Regional Director – Eastern Region, AMCHAM, gave the introductions. Mr. Subrata Bagchi, Chairman – Eastern Region, AMCHAM, gave the welcome address. Mr. Shyamal Datta former Government of Nagaland and Former Director Intelligence Bureau, Government of India, was the chief guest.

In his opening remarks Mr. Datta said that information technology has been one of the finest creations of the human mind. Stakeholders, in government, corporates, science and technology, consider it their responsibility to guard against it being hijacked by adversaries with their devious and clandestine designs of physical, biological and cyber-attacks. Mr. Datta said cyber security has emerged as the fifth most important domain of strategic importance after land, air, sea and space. The internet has become the backbone of commerce and communication which constitute the very lifeline of human existence. This has brought into play an intense competition to innovate and acquire technologies superior to those in existence. In the process, the technologies have become outdated and also proliferated faster, much to the detriment of interests of regulatory bodies. The newer acquisitions have replenished the armory. Both have compounded challenges for the security management. Besides supervision and monitoring, the task of ensuring safety and security of infrastructures and networks on land and hallow international waters has become indeed very challenging. Retaining an edge and remaining on top in order to keep the adversaries at bay, has become formidable. Mr. Datta emphasized a bloodless and silent war is, therefore, on round the clock to cause sleepless nights for the management of security. Those who master the technology and the security know-how and skills are considered better equipped.

Mr. Koushik Nath, Sr. Security Architect, Cisco, in his overview of the topic said that we are passing through a time when radical business transformations are inevitable due to disruptions triggered by technology evolutions. As industry is embracing 4.0, the digitization wave is also bringing challenges which were never anticipated! Today, virtually anyone can use malicious programs to attack without even knowing how to write a software program! Over the years, computer attacks have become economically profitable for a large segment of smart people who can penetrate any systems and hack data. The market of cybercrime business is well over several trillion USD and that's an attracting proposition. Mr. Nath talked about threats like crypto mining, and emotet which follows the money and mostly bypasses the user/security tool's attention. In the coming years as more and more things are getting connected to internet, the threat landscape would increase and malicious players will certainly gain grounds. In this increasingly challenging situation, organizations need to work closely with security service providers and build a trusted ecosystem which can work hand-in-hand to reasonably minimize the business risk. Security should be integrated into the organization's DNA and this can be achieved only when people, process and technology come together.

Mr. Abhirup Guha gave a detailed presentation covering a wide range of incidences and scenarios which could take place and why it was important for a safety net to be in place. He concluded by saying that the cyber threat landscape is ever changing thus making conventional information security mechanisms less impactful each day. New threats like cloud compromise, deep web data breach, easy identity impersonation, and new threat vectors like polycryptominers, hybrid APT with a capability of changing itself from trojan to ransomware based on AI and devices capable to automatically write and execute malware without any user intervention by bypassing DLP are some of the latest threats. The attackers never rest and always pioneer and exploit new technologies, so its crucial to be aware about the latest threats first, to stay a step ahead of the adversaries. Mr. Joydeep Datta Gupta, Member - Eastern Region Executive Committee, AMCHAM, gave the concluding remarks.

23rd Aug 2019 Eastern Region Executive Committee Meeting

Mr. Subrata Bagchi, Chairman – Eastern Region, AMCHAM hosted the Executive Committee meeting at his office in Kolkata on August 23rd. He updated members on the recently held interaction session on 'Evolving Nature of Cyber Security – Attacks, Incidence, Impact and Response.' He said that the demonstration done was an eye opener for members. Mr. Shobhan Kumar, Executive Committee member also said that his IT team benefited immensely from the session. Upcoming sessions were discussed and the NextGen Leadership Program was also tabled. It was decided that the Eastern Region would roll out its inaugural session on September 6th. Membership issues were also discussed. The meeting concluded with a cake cutting ceremony and thanks to the Chair and TCG Digital Solutions for hosting the meeting.

29th Aug 2019 Meeting with Mr. Joseph M. Pomper, Minister Counselor for Consular Affairs, U.S. Embassy on the New Interview Waiver Scheduling System On August 29th AMCHAM's Eastern Region organized an interactive session over high tea at the Hyatt Regency Kolkata, with Mr. Joseph Pomper, Minister Counselor for Consular Affairs, U.S. Embassy, New Delhi, Ms. Amy Gradin, Vice Counsel, U.S. Consulate Kolkata and the Consular team. This was Mr. Pomper's farewell visit to Kolkata before he departed India. Mr. Pomper said that the U.S.-India trade relationship has been growing exponentially in recent years; two-way trade between the United States and India in 2017 increased by \$12 billion to \$126 billion and the United States is India's number one export destination. He said more than a million people travel between the countries annually. In FY 2018, over 1.2 million visas were adjudicated in the five consular sections across India. In FY 2018, over 235,000 people in India applied for U.S. visas via the interview waiver program. Beginning September 1st, 2019, the U.S. Mission to India would begin to schedule interview waiver passport drop-off. Previously, applicants did not need to schedule an appointment to drop off their passports. This procedure applies to individuals renewing U.S. visas that have expired less than one year before and to applicants under age 14 or over age 79. He said the goal in implementing an appointment scheduling system for applicants dropping off passports for visa renewal was to improve customer service and reduce overall processing times. As a result of this change, the Embassy and Consulates anticipate being able to reduce the processing times from three weeks to 7-10 business days. From September 1st, applicants eligible for interview waiver processing can schedule an appointment date via on the website, www.ustraveldocs.com and drop off their passport and visa application materials at one of the eleven Visa Application Center locations across India. He said that FAQs on the new Interview Waiver scheduling which was distributed at the meet could be shared amongst members. Ms. Amada Kidwai, Regional Director, gave introductions, Mr. Shobhan Kumar, Member - Eastern Region Executive Committee, AMCHAM, gave the welcome address and Mr. K.P. Sengupta, Member - Eastern Region Executive Committee member of AMCHAM, gave the concluding remarks and vote of thanks. 2nd Oct 2019 AMCHAM's Eastern Region supported United Way Plog Run On October 2nd, United Way Eastern Region organized a Plog Run to commemorate the 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. AMCHAM's Eastern Region supported the event with member companies participating. Around 350 people participated in fluorescent orange and green aprons. The ploggers were split into three groups covering 3 different locations in the city, each running approximately 3 km picking up trash along the way. The panelists at the inaugural session were Mr. Sanjay Budhia, Industrialist, Managing Director, Patton India, Mr. Arnab Basu, Managing Partner East & Technology Consulting Leader, PwC India, Prof. Mrutyunjay Mohanty, IIM Kolkata, Mr. Bishwanath Jha, IRS Principal Chief Commissioner of Income Tax, Kolkata and Mr. Kaushik Mukherjee, Tax Partner, PWC and Executive Committee Member – Eastern Region, AMCHAM. The panelists gave their interpretation of the budget announcement viz-a-via its expectations, the finer details of the finance bill and how it impacts business.

He said that leaders around the world agreed that these two are linked to the future of the new millennium. He said that corporate social responsibility as "a business approach that contributes to sustainable development by delivering economic, social and environmental benefits for all stakeholders" with the key point being "sustainable development."

Mr. Jayant Kataria spoke about the Hyatt's global CSR programs and how it worked around the world with local players. He also highlighted their supporting partners in Kolkata and spoke about the skill development program that Hyatt Kolkata was doing which gives students with financial challenges an opportunity for employment. 11th Mar 2020 Panel Discussion on #EachforEqual – An Equal World for an Enabled World

In Kolkata on March 11th, AMCHAM's Eastern Region, in partnership with the Hyatt Regency, organized a panel discussion on #EachforEqual – An Equal World for an Enabled World, which included diversity and inclusiveness. The event was graced by eminent personalities from all walks of life who shared their experience in their journey to success.

Ms. Amada Kidwai, Regional Director – Eastern India, AMCHAM, did the introductions. Mr. Subrata Bagchi, Chairman – Eastern Region, AMCHAM and President, TCG Digital, gave the opening remarks. Ms. Monica Shie, Director, American Center of U.S. Consul General in Kolkata, was the chief guest. Ms. Ondrilla Dutt, CEO, Open Doors, moderated the session. Ms. Usha Uthup, performer and Padma Shree awardee in 2011 was the guest of honor. The panelists were Mr. Shobhan Kumar, General Manager, Hyatt and member of AMCHAM's Eastern Region Executive Committee, Ms. Alokananda Roy, internationally acclaimed exponent of Indian classical dance who works with rehabilitation of women and child prisoners through dance therapy, Ms. Richa Sharma, an actress who also works with women who have suffered domestic violence and Mr. Nil, fashion designer and gay rights activist who is very involved in the LBGT movement in Kolkata.

Mr. Bagchi, in his welcome address spoke about Gloria Steinem, world-renowned feminist, journalist and activist who said the story of women's struggle for equality belongs to no single person nor to any one organization but to the collective efforts of all who care about human rights" and said that collectively we can all play a part and take on the shared responsibility for driving a gender equal world. He said that though the median number of women on Indian boards had doubled in the past five years, they still form a small proportion of the total board members. He spoke about the February 2020 Supreme Court of India ruling that women officers in the Indian army can get command positions at par with male officers. The court also said that permanent commission should be available to all women, regardless of years of service, and order must be implemented in 3 months. This he said was a milestone for women officers in the Armed forces.

Ms. Monica Shie spoke about her own personal journey and highlighted the U.S. government's objectives. She said that when women were economically empowered, they re-invest in their families and communities, producing a multiplier effect that spurs economic growth and contributes to global peace and stability. Women use their earnings to buy food, pay school fees, purchase medicine, that's why women must be enabled. To that end, the U.S. government funds a number of programs aimed at promoting entrepreneurship, particularly among women. The U.S. Consulate Kolkata recently funded a program called "Breaking the Glass Ceiling," which pays for selected women entrepreneurs to participate in online trainings, a boot camp, and pitch sessions to enable them to build partnerships, secure funding, and create innovate goods and services. They also support the Global Links India Alumni Connect Program, which pairs business school students with women entrepreneurs in eastern India to grow their small businesses. The entrepreneurs receive structured training provided by the business students, while students gain hands-on experience with how businesses operate in the real world.

Last year, the U.S. Department of State and USAID signed the U.S. Alliance for Women's Economic Empowerment in partnership with Georgetown University, George Washington University and USISPF. The Alliance enables the private sector, academia, and civil society in the United States and India to collaborate in accelerating the growth of women-owned businesses and women's workforce participation by increasing access to finance, mentoring, and technical assistance. The U.S. has also been partnering with India for three years now on the Women Entrepreneurship Platform (WEP), which highlights existing Government of India programs for women entrepreneurs and assists them in identifying future partners, including American companies such as Google and Facebook.

Ms. Ondrilla Dutt, CEO, Open Doors, moderated the session and introduced the panellists to the audience and invited the panellists to share their own special journey. Ms. Usha Uthup shared her own journey and spoke about her conservative family upbringing and how she was thrown out of music class in school because she didn't fit in with a voice like hers. Even though she was not formally trained in music, she grew up in an atmosphere of music. She spoke about how she has spread the message of love and unity and harmony, tolerance integrity, happiness peace for over 44 years and through music from discotheques to concerts, across Lundia and the Wwrld, she has addressed the youth about the values of music that makes us human. She has sung in 15 Indian languages and several foreign languages also.

Ms. Alokananda Roy, an internationally acclaimed exponent of Indian classical dance, spoke about her reforms for jail inmates, especially for convicts under-trials through her art and love-therapy which has

provided new life to hardened criminals. She said that while her love is in surfeit, she is not the one to pull punches while addressing societal injustice. She refuses to espouse stale political pronouncements and never lacks the inner strength to face injustice, whoever be her opponent. She has lived up to her guru Rishi Aurobindo's words, "The great are strongest when they stand alone, a God-given might of being is their force." Ms. Richa Sharma said that being an Indian woman has neither been a privilege nor a hurdle for her. An Indian actress for Bollywood and Tollywood films, a fashion icon, the brand ambassador for an Italian wine, olives and olive oil company, and by taking her coveted position to become a role model to motivate and encourage other women to reach newer heights. She spoke about her work with a number of NGOs towards the development of less privileged women and children in and around Kolkata. The audience were also shown clips of her latest movie "Every 68 Minutes" which takes a hard hitting look at the social imbalance and the horrors associated with it.

Mr. Kumar Shobhan, General Manager of Hyatt Regency Kolkata, has spent 21 years in the hospitality industry in a number of remarkable roles. As a people centric professional he spoke about the initiates Hyatt has put in place. He has been critical in acknowledging the importance of playing his part to make gender equality a reality with increase in ratio of women work force at Hyatt Regency Kolkata. Mr. Nil spoke about his own upbringing from a very conservative family discussed his struggles particularly about wanting a career in fashion design rather than the norm of what family and society wanted from him. He discussed his mother's support and encouragement which allowed him to make his own path. He spoke about his active support in gay pride which is the promotion of self-affirmation, dignity, equality, which works towards opposing the shame and social stigma, which is the predominant outlook that bolsters most LGBT rights.

Sengupta, Co-Chairman, Data Core Systems, took a minute to speak about the company policy of his own organization highlighting the work women do and Mr. Joydeep Datta Gupta, Partner, Deloitte, gave the concluding remarks and vote of thanks and spoke about the initiatives taken by Deloitte. The session ended with Ms. Usha Uthup, enthralling the audience with some songs and Mr. Francis Lepcher, performer and singer, entertaining members with songs dedicated to the theme of the session.
